SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

Once a snow emergency is declared, the snow removal process begins and the Watervliet Police Department informs residents to move their vehicles. Failure to do so will result in immediately being towed to Hudson Shores Park. Vehicles will not be released until the tow charge and ticket of \$350 (tow \$250/fine \$100) is paid. Once plowing on your street is complete, vehicles can be moved back. In an effort to keep residents informed, we put together an emergency call list. This enables us to notify residents by

phone and text if a snow emergency is declared. To be placed on this list, call City Hall at 518-270-3815 or log onto www.watervliet.com (under "Emergency Info Center" click REGISTER). Landlords are encouraged to have tenants register. You can also call 518-270-3823 to hear a pre-recorded message regarding snow emergencies. All radio and TV stations will be notified including WVLT. Snow emergencies are also announced on City Facebook pages and the City's website.

Unauthorized Vehicle Parking Ordinance

On October 11th the City Council passed the following ordinance which goes into effect November 15th: It shall be unlawful to park any backhoe, bulldozer or excavation equipment, bus, house coach, limousine, school bus, tractor trailer, semi trailer or combination thereof, stinger-steered automobile, transporter, mobile car crusher, solid waste collection vehicle, concrete mixer truck, chemical/gas truck, fuel or oil truck, boat, boat trailer, utility trailer, truck trailer, dump truck, either by itself or in combination with trailer, recreational vehicle or tow truck on any City street within the hours of 7:00 p.m.-6:00 a.m. This does not apply to vehicles and equipment used by public service utility companies when repairing or extending public service utilities and municipal vehicles. There appears to be an increasing number of these vehicles within our City which limits the amount of available parking to residents and takes away from the aesthetics of our neighborhoods.
