

On Monday, December 9, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. the council meeting for the Town of Gay was called to order by Mayor Walker. At roll call, all council members were present. It was determined a quorum did exist.

The first item was to approve the Consent Agenda. Council member Watts motioned to approve the agenda, seconded by council member Askvig. The vote in favor was unanimous.

The next item was approval of the Agenda. Council member Askvig motioned to approve the agenda, seconded by council member Keith. The vote in favor was unanimous.

The only item on the agenda was bids for a City Hall Sign, which had been postponed from the previous meeting. Because of diversity in design and options presented, bidders were requested to resubmit their bid so council could compare actual signs. Council member Askvig recused herself from any discussion and vote, to avoid any conflict of interest. After discussion and comparison of signs, including probable life of the sign, council member Watts motioned to select the bid presented by Shane's Artistic Designs, for \$2,889.00. The motion was seconded by council member Pritchett and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Council member Watts requested that after the beginning of the year, our agenda should include discussion of the Intergovernmental Agreement presented by Meriwether County for Building Permits.

Council member Watts said she had a discussion with the assistant clerk regarding some concerns. It was agreed that prior to the next council meeting on January 13, 2025 we meet at 6:00 p.m. for this work session with the clerk present to express any concerns.

Mayor Walker attended the Mayors meeting and he gave council an overview of discussion of Recreation Opportunities in Meriwether County. They all want to get past the preconceived idea that only football, basketball and baseball are available. In fact, each of the towns has something different and available which also needs to be recognized and included.

The last item for discussion was Financial Documents. Council member Askvig motioned to accept the documents, seconded by council member Watts. The vote in favor was unanimous.

As there was no more business to discuss, council member Watts motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:00 p.m., seconded by council member Keith. The vote in favor was unanimous.
