THE WORD OF GOD

THE FIRST LESSON - JOEL 2:12-19

“Yet even now,” declares the LORD, “return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.” Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, “Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, ‘Where is their God?’” Then the LORD became jealous for his land and had pity on his people. The LORD answered and said to his people, jealous for his land and had pity on his people. The LORD answered and said to his people, “Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.”

THE PSALMODY - PSALM 51:1-19

L: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your lovingkindness; in your great compassion blot out my offenses.

C: Wash me through and through from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin.

L: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

C: Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight.

L: And so you are justified when you speak and upright in your judgment.

C: Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth, a sinner from my mother’s womb.

L: For behold, you look for truth deep within me, and will make me understand wisdom secretly.

C: Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

L: Make me hear of joy and gladness, that the body you have broken may rejoice.

C: Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities.

L: Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

C: Cast me not away from your presence and take not your Holy Spirit from me.

L: Give me the joy of your saving help again and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.

C: I shall teach your ways to the wicked, and sinners shall return to you.

L: Deliver me from death, O God, and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, O God of my salvation.

C: Open my lips, O LORD, and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

L: Had you desired it, I would have offered sacrifice, but you take no delight in burnt offerings.

C: The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

L: Be favorable and gracious to Zion, and rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

C: Then you will be pleased with the appointed sacrifices, with burnt offerings and oblations; then shall they offer young bullocks upon your altar.

SECOND LESSON - 2 CORINTHIANS 5:20B-6:10

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says, “In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you.” Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

L: Here ends the reading.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 6th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

THE GOSPEL - MATTHEW 6:1-6, 16-21

Jesus said, “Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the

synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. “And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

ASH WEDNESDAY RESPONSE PRAYERS

P: Holy and righteous God, as we begin again the solemn spiritual journey of Lent, we

come before You in deep humility. We confess that we are sinners, both by the nature we inherit and by the sinful thoughts and desires, words and actions that nature produces. Because of our sins, we deserve only Your wrath and punishment. Yet You reveal Yourself, not only as a God of holiness and justice but as a God of mercy and love. Despairing of our own merits and worthiness, and in response to Your gracious invitation, we come pleading for Your forgiveness.

C: Lord, have mercy on us for Your holy name’s sake.

P: You have revealed Your love and mercy for us sinners in Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Savior. You sent Him into our world to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of all people. Help us grasp by faith the great truth that the pain and suffering, the mockery and ridicule, and the death and punishment He endured should have been ours. Help us understand that in incomprehensible love He suffered and died for us.

C: Lord, have mercy on us for Your Jesus’ sake.

P: In silent meditation let us reflect on our sins, praise our Savior for the forgiveness He has won for us, and ask for God’s continued grace to remove any doubt that we are forgiven.

P: God of grace and mercy, may Your Spirit continue to be with us as we follow the way of the cross. As we contemplate the story of our Savior’s passion, build us up in our faith. Renew in us the zeal to serve You by reflecting Your love in our lives. Give us the desire and the ability to boldly proclaim the grace in which we stand, so that all for whom You lived and died may join us in fellowship now and in Your presence forever.

C: We offer our humble thanks and praise, our prayers and petitions, and ourselves in body and spirit to You, Lord God. Hear us, according to Your promise, for Jesus’ sake. Amen.
