"For His invisible attributes, namely His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So people are without excuse." - Romans 1:20

I don't know about you, but one of the most discernable places I find evidence of God's continual presence and creative power is in nature. There is something about being alone with God in the splendor of His creation that awakens my heart and my soul to worship Him with a renewed sense of awe and wonder. Scripture tells us that this was God's intended reaction when He made the world around us. He has embedded the imprints of "His eternal power and divine nature" into every blade of grass, every blooming flower, every singing bird, every beam of sunlight that touches your face. All of creation serves to point to the Creator.

In fact, God has embedded within us the capacity for re-creation. Human have created wonderful works of art, poetry, sculptures, architecture, feats of engineering, and so on. But in reality, nothing made by human hands is ever truly created, in the sense that we cannot form something out of nothing. We must rely on the raw materials and intellect that God has already given us, so all human creations are actually a mere re-shaping of God's creation, but this does not take away from the beauty of those works. If anything, it is all the more beautiful because every human work of creativity is a reflection of the One whose creative image we bear. Some works more readily reflect this reality than others, and indeed we should never misuse God's gift of creativity, but the point remains: all created things (and to a lesser degree "recreated" things) present an overwhelming mountain of evidence, such that to deny our Creator would be to deny rationality. Truly, we are without excuse.

As the summer months are upon us, I would encourage you to take some time for recreation. That is, find something that edifies and connects you with God our Creator. Whether that thing is reading, or painting, or hiking, or simply spending time with loved ones – take time to relax and enjoy it, but more than that, talk to God as you do so and listen for His still, small voice that reverberates through all aspects of creation.



# **Charitable Giving**

Do you know you may be able to avoid federal income taxes on otherwise taxable distributions if you are drawing from a Traditional IRA? If you are taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMD), you can direct some or all of your RMD to one or more Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD). QCD amounts are not included as income when filing your federal taxes. You do not have to itemize deductions when filing to receive the savings.
