From the Pastor's Desk

"If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is worthless, and so is your faith. In that case, we are also exposed as false witnesses about God. For we have testified about God that He raised Christ from the dead, but He did not raise Him if in fact the dead are not raised." – 1 Corinthians 15:13–15

Suppose you were a farmer and you knew that it was going to rain. You saw the storm clouds on the horizon, and you decided "now is a good time to go out and water my crops." That would seem like an exercise in futility, would it not? It might even damage your crops if they got too much water. In the passage above, Paul emphasizes the futility and meaninglessness of the Christian life (and life in general) if there is no resurrection. The truth is that if Jesus hadn't been raised from the dead, then Christianity is pointless and a waste of time.

The resurrection of Christ is the lynchpin that our entire lives and faith hinge on. Why, then, would anyone want to leave such a vital detail unexplored and unassured? Yet, that is what many Christians do. According to a LifeWay research poll, when it comes to belief that Jesus Christ was literally and physically raised from the dead, "Twothirds of Americans (64 percent) say the biblical accounts of the physical (bodily) resurrection of Jesus are completely accurate. A quarter (23 percent) disagree. Thirteen percent are not sure." When it comes to the resurrection, the fact of the matter is that there are plenty of eyewitness testimonies – from the Gospels, yes, but also testimonies outside of the Bible – which verify the details of Jesus' death and even His resurrection. To deny these pieces of evidence would make about as much sense as denying that George Washington ever crossed the Delaware River. The Gospels provide a clear account that Jesus was raised from the dead—not just metaphorically or spiritually, but by a resurrection of his physical body. This is important because if the Bible is untrustworthy on that point, why should we trust it for anything else? In faith, we can believe God's Word, but it is not an unreasoning faith.

During Lent, we are asked to dig deeper in our faith; to not simply scatter seed on the soil of our heart, cross our fingers and wish that it grows, but to do the work of tilling the soil so that the seed of God's Word can be deeply embedded in us. Some farmers lay a thick layer of wood chips over their crops during the winter. This provides a rich layer of decomposable material which provides nutrients to the soil and prepares it for planting in the spring. As spring and Easter approaches, let us brush off the dead layer of "wood chips" in our hearts and look ahead to a new season of planting and growth, trusting what God has in store for us.




The women of St. Andrew are putting together


Easter Flower Orders
