From the Pastor's Desk

"I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." - Luke 18:14

I don't typically listen to the radio when I'm in the car, or if I do it's the local Christian station (WGRC). However, this week our van needed some repairs so we got a rental car while it was in the shop. As I was driving this rental van, a song I hadn't heard before came on the radio (which was not tuned to the Christian station). The song was called, *Need a Favor* by Jelly Roll. I was about to turn the station, when the lyrics of

the song caught me off guard. It said:

I only talk to God when I need a favor And I only pray when I ain't got a prayer So, who the h*** am I, who the h*** am I to expect a Savior, oh If I only talk to God when I need a favor? But God, I need a favor

Without condoning the language used, I thought the message was interesting. My first thought was "this secular song is more honest than some modern worship songs." That is not intended as a formal critique or rebuke of modern worship music, just an observation. It reminds me of the parable Jesus told in Luke chapter 18 about the Pharisee and the Publican. Both men stood on the street corner praying to God, but the Pharisee's prayer was loaded with self-righteousness while the tax collector's prayer was simple, honest and contrite. He simply prayed, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." And who did God listen to? The tax collector. Jesus said, "I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God."

Our prayers don't need to be flowery or long-winded, they just need to be honest. A professor of mine once recalled how on his commute to work in the mornings he would ask God for a good parking spot. On the surface, this may seem like an inconsequential prayer, and maybe it is, but in his words, "if it's important enough for you to care about, it's important enough to talk to God about." God desires our presence, not our pretense. He wants to hear from us regularly, even in the mundane - especially in the mundane, because it is those moments where authentic relationships are built.

Not only does God desire to hear from us, but He desires to speak to us as well. However, if our hearts and ears are only open when we "need a favor," then we will miss out on so much that God has to share with us. My challenge to you (and myself) is to practice godly mindfulness - to increase our awareness of God's constant presence, from the mundane moments to the extraordinary ones. Take time to pray, but also take time to listen. See how His goodness and mercy run through your life like a flowing stream of living water, because "the Lord is good to those who wait for Him, to the soul who seeks Him" (Lamentations 3:25).




May Care Cards



Mother's Day Men's Choir




Attention all guys, young and not so young!


