From the Pastor's Desk

"[Christ] was chosen before the creation of the world, but was revealed in these last times for your sake." - 1 Peter 1:20

Names are very important in life. For example, without a name it would be much harder to know when someone wanted to address us. In the Bible, names also carry a much broader significance than a mere conversational placeholder; names carry identity. Several times in the Bible, after a significant shift in a person's identity, that person would receive a new name. Abram became Abraham, Jacob became Israel, Saul became Paul, etc.

I shared this in our Genesis Bible study but was asked to share it here as well, so I will. In Genesis chapter 5, there is a list of names from Adam to Noah. We may be tempted when reading genealogies such as these to gloss over them and not pay them much attention, but Scripture is so rich in meaning that we can plumb the depths of even an unassuming list of names and find incredible truth hidden within. Going down the list from Genesis 5, we have ten names: Adam, Seth, Enosh, Kenan, Mahalalel, Jared, Enoch, Methuselah, Lamech and Noah. Each of these names carries meaning. Adam means "man", Seth means "appointed", Enosh means "mortal", Kenan means "sorrow", Mahalalel means "the blessed God", Jared means "shall come down", Enoch means "teaching", Methuselah means "his death shall bring", Lamech means "despairing" and Noah means "comfort" or "rest." When we read those names in order using their meanings, it spells out a beautiful message: "Man (is) appointed mortal sorrow, (but) the blessed God shall come down teaching. His death shall bring (the) despairing comfort and rest."

Here, thousands of years before Jesus came to earth, we see a message of God's plan for salvation. It has always been God's plan to send Jesus to redeem us, since before the creation of the world (1 Peter 1:20). There has never been nor will there ever be a plan B. For those of us who have accepted Him, the Bible says we are now new creations (2) Corinthians 5:17) with new identities and we will even receive a new name to reflect that (Revelation 2:17). Our new name will be given to us in heaven, but our new identity is given to us the moment we are saved. No longer does a Christian identify with the world or the things of the flesh, but we are to be focused on Christ and live our lives through the lens of eternity. Sadly, too many Christians have not fully embraced their identity in Christ; we would rather identify as our job title, or our political affiliation, or any of the other labels that we accumulate. But Christ is not another label that we can slap on our nametag; He is everything. He is our identity, He is our purpose, He is our vision, He is our life. When we lack identity, we lack purpose; when we lack purpose, we lack vision; without vision, we perish (Proverbs 29:18). Jesus came to save us from a futile way of living and thinking about ourselves and others. He came so that we may have life (John 10:10). Let's be thankful for that gift every day and remind ourselves that we are His.
