From the Pastor's Desk

This may be a familiar memory – your family gathered around the Christmas tree on Christmas morning, eager to see what Santa has brought them. With it being the Christmas season, I thought I could share with you a tradition that we have in the Lander household. On Christmas, before we open any gifts we take time to sit down together and open the greatest gift, which continues to give – day in, day out, year after year: that gift is God's word.

In Martin Luther's exposition of Psalm 122, he says this: "Among all the gifts, the gift of the Word of God is the most valuable. For if you take this away, it is like taking the sun away from the earth. For if the Word were removed, what would the world be but a hell and mere realm of Satan... For only the Word keeps a joyful conscience, a gracious God, and all of religion, since out of the Word, as from a spring, flows our entire religion. Without the Word and Christ the world would not continue to exist for one moment. Therefore, though there are many great gifts of God in the world...yet the one which includes and sustains all the others is the Word, which proclaims that God is merciful and promises forgiveness of sins and life everlasting."

Our children have told us that their favorite part of Christmas is that it's Jesus' birthday. They then proceeded to ask if we could sing 'happy birthday' to Jesus and get him a cake and a present. To them, there's still a sort of sacred harmony between the religious and the festive. But to paraphrase C.S. Lewis, there comes a point in every child's life where they begin to separate the religious from the festive aspects of Christmas. Christmas gifts will no longer seem sacramental. And when that happens, we're left with a choice. Which one do we put first? If we put the spiritual first, we can still experience something of the wonder of Christmas. But if we put the gifts first, they'll soon become nothing more than any other trinket.

It's difficult this time of year not to get preoccupied with the commercialism and getting the perfect gift for someone. According to the website "statistic brain", here is an abbreviated list of the "must-have" gifts of the past few decades: in 1983, the must-have gift was a cabbage patch doll. In 1985, it was Pound Puppies that went for \$18 apiece. In 1989 it was the popular handheld gaming system, the original GameBoy. 1995 was the height of the Beanie Baby craze and everyone was scrambling to collect them. The next year they fizzled out and everyone was scrounging to find the elusive "tickle me Elmo," which even incited mobs of frenzied shoppers. Moving into the 2000's, there was iPod in 2002, the Wii in 2006, a Kindle in 2010, the singing Frozen Elsa doll in 2015... Each year the fads change and our attention is pulled in a different direction, but the Word of God is unchanging. It's a gift that offers joy and hope in the midst of life's difficulties. It offers strength in our weakness. It offers instruction in the face of uncertainty. In so many words, it offers life.
