FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



"O God, You are my God; earnestly I seek You; my soul thirsts for You; my flesh faints for You...my soul clings to You; Your right hand upholds me." - Psalm 63:1a,8

David penned the words of Psalm 63 while in the wilderness of Judah fleeing for his life. Both literally and figuratively, David was in a desolate place. Yet, even in his time of wandering and great need, David says that his soul thirsts for God. Before he cries out for his physical needs to be met, he seeks the One who will satisfy his soul.

In Jesus' own time spent in the desert, the first temptation that Satan brings up is the temptation to turn stones into bread - to choose the things that only satisfy temporarily. Jesus, of course, responds to this temptation with Scripture. He says, "it is written: man shall not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." This is not to say that food and shelter and other necessities are not important; God knows they are, but He also knows that they are temporary. Rather, He desires that we would seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all those other things will be added unto us as well (Matthew 6:33).

In the words of A.W. Tozer, "we are called to an everlasting preoccupation with God." Christians are often accused of being "narrow-minded" by those whose minds are so narrow they cannot conceive of anything beyond what's temporary and fleeting. The only Christians who are narrow-minded are the ones who think that once they've found God, they no longer need to seek Him. He is to our souls a perpetual fountain in the wilderness, a stream of living water. When we dwell on His goodness, when we feast on His Word, when we abide in His presence, what we find is a satisfaction that cannot be bought or manufactured. David finds this satisfaction in verse 5: "I will be fully satisfied as with the richest of foods; with singing lips my mouth will praise You."

The paradox of faith is that we may be fully satisfied in Christ, yet always hungering and thirsting for more of Him. Jesus said in Matthew 5:6, "blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled." Perhaps another way to put it is "blessed are the unsatisfied, because they will keep searching for Me until they are filled." My prayer for each of us is that we would be a little unsatisfied. The temptation of religion is to settle for satisfaction too early; to stubbornly cling to traditions of dead men until we've sucked all the marrow out of their bones. To be sure, we owe much to those who have come before us and we should certainly honor and uphold them. But we should never be content to exchange their faith for our own. In the words of theologian Jaroslav Pelikan, "tradition is the living faith of the dead; traditionalism is the dead faith of the living." Tradition is alive and vibrant when we allow it to speak to our present context and the only way it can do that is by the living Word of God, who desires for us to have a fresh yearning for Him.

Small Group Bible Study


Our Thursday Small Group Bible Study will resume on September 5th at 2:30p.m. in the Parish Hall on a
