On July 4, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was ratified and signed by the members of the first Continental Congress. Two-hundred and forty-six years later, we still celebrate that day as the birthday of our great nation. Of the things our country is known for, *freedom* is probably the word most associated with America. We celebrate many freedoms, and we are so grateful to those throughout the years who have fought and even died defending our God-given liberty.

But what good is freedom if it is not exercised? Essentially, a freedom declined is a freedom forfeit. If enough people were to decline enough of their freedoms, we would be left with a form of self-imposed tyranny, blown by the ever-changing winds of cultural opinion. That may sound sensational, but I don't think we need to strain our imaginations very hard to envision such a world of pseudo-freedoms.

As Christians in America, we have the blessing to enjoy many freedoms that our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ around the globe simply do not. Yet, in our complacency, so often we decline the exercise of these freedoms. If we are not careful, we run the risk of forfeiting that which we take for granted. That being said, here is a list of freedoms which I would strongly encourage us to exercise every chance we get:

- **The freedom to worship.** Being able to gather freely and worship God without fear of imprisonment or persecution is a gift that not every Christian in the world has. Yet sadly, church attendance in America is at an all-time low. The church is a place where we can experience authentic Christian community through the bonds of love and mutual faith. It is a place where we gather not only to worship, but to learn, share, serve, and encourage one another. Where would the world be if the Church suddenly disappeared?

Hopefully we will never have to know the answer to that question, but while we have the freedom to do so, “let us not neglect meeting together, as some have made a habit, but let us encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.” (Hebrews 10:25)

- **The freedom to vote.** According to surveys, millions of American Christians don’t exercise their freedom to vote. I understand the temptation to abstain from voting, especially if there seems to be no good candidate or if you’ve lost faith in the system. But as Christians, our faith does not belong to a system; our faith belongs to a God who “is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all we ask or think.” (Ephesians 3:20). Elected officials – not just the president, but governors, senators, and representatives – all derive their authority from the consent of the governed. By declining our freedom to vote, we effectively ensure that Biblical values and concerns are misrepresented, underrepresented or not represented at all.
- **The freedom to pray.** We have the freedom in this country to pray openly, yet so often we are afraid or even ashamed to pray in public. Despite what some government and educational institutions may have us think, the freedom to pray is not something that can be mandated or revoked. In Daniel’s day, King Darius tried to do just that. He demanded that everyone in Babylon pray only to him, but Daniel refused and so was tossed into the lion’s den. However, because of Daniel’s faithfulness and courage, God shut the mouths of the lions as a display of His sovereignty over them and even the king. As a result, the king repented. Never underestimate the power of prayer, for “the prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.” (James 5:16). Prayer should not simply be something we recite before meals or before bed; prayer is a posture of the heart that is constantly inclined toward God.
- **The freedom to share your faith.** In some countries, this freedom is nonexistent. The very mention of Jesus is punishable by imprisonment or even death. We must continually pray for those Christian brothers and sisters living under such tyranny. For those of us fortunate enough not to live in such fear, we would do well to exercise and share our faith as often as possible. Not only does this obey Christ’s command to “make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 28:19), but it plants the seed of the Gospel in others’ hearts that one day may blossom and we will have won a new brother or sister in Christ. Let us keep our minds fixed on Christ, and let us have the courage to speak up for Him as well.

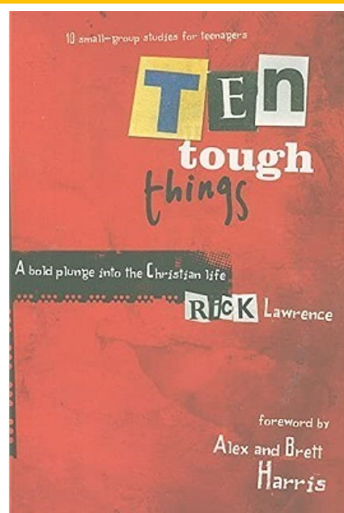
