"Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap." - Galatians 6:7

I came across an interesting article recently in *Christianity Today* written by Russel Moore. In it, he addresses a growing trend he refers to as "extremism inflation." Simply put, people have a tendency to portray a carefully curated version of themselves in public (and especially on social media) that may not match up with reality. In recent years, the culture wars and political division have driven a deep wedge between all kinds of people groups (politics, religion, gender, age and race, to name a few). People's identities have become so enmeshed with their political or cultural affiliations such that loyalty to that affiliation demands them to adopt an ever-inflating array of values and social mores that may or may not actually line up with their personally held convictions. On top of that, the "outrage machine" demands tribute from each member of said group, or else risk becoming the target of the cancel culture.

The problem with this formula is that for those who just "go along to get along", they have already violated their own integrity and stepped onto the slippery slope of becoming that which they once dismissed as "fearmongering nonsense." In the words of Russel Moore, "You can pretend your way to vice, but not to virtue...that's because integrity and morality and godliness do not come about by outward demonstration. Whitewashing the tomb does nothing to enliven the decomposing corpses underneath (Matthew 23:27-29)...the way of Christ starts with a recognition of lack - of the kind of empty-handedness that puts away falsehood (Ephesians 4:25)."

The season of Lent is an invitation to set aside all of our pretenses and return to God in humble vulnerability, confessing our sins, receiving His forgiveness, and committing to walk with Christ daily in Spirit and in Truth (John 4:24). If we are to live openly and honestly before others, we must first be open and honest with ourselves and with God. Saint Thomas Aquinas says that "Truth lies between excess and defect; that we judge the thing neither greater than it is nor less than it is, but *as* it is." Pertaining to our sin, we confess that all sin separates us from God and incurs the penalty of death (Romans 6:23). Pertaining to salvation, we confess that Christ's once-for-all sacrifice is sufficient to cover all sins and if we confess those sins, God is faithful to forgive us (John 3:16-18, 1 John 1:9). What the Bible calls sin, we should not judge as anything less than sin - even if the culture tells us we are "hateful" or "bigoted". What the Bible does **not** call sin, we should not judge as sin - even if our well-meaning brother or sister in Christ has a different conviction. This is what biblical discernment looks like - allowing the lens of Scripture to inform our **entire** lives - public, private and anything in between.


As we journey toward the cross this Lent, I encourage you to open yourself up (perhaps for the first time in a long time) to being vulnerable with God, yourself and others about your struggles and triumphs, joys and sorrows. Resist the temptation to put on a mask, and embrace the (sometimes scary) freedom of being known and loved by God *and* each other. Prayerfully what you will find is a greater sense of peace and the confidence to let your light shine, boldly and authentically before others, that they may see your good deeds - not as a virtue signal, but as the fruit of a life lived in true communion with God.
