From the Pastor's Desk

The secret things belong to the LORD our God, but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law." Deuteronomy 29:29

As we wrap up another Lenten season and celebrate the joy of Easter, I am humbled by the great mystery of it all. We know that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son. We know that Jesus came to earth as a baby in Bethlehem, lived a sinless life, performed many miracles, taught with power and authority, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. We know that on that glorious Easter morning He was raised to life and He now lives forever, seated at the right hand of the Father. We know that all who believe in Him will not die, but have eternal life.

What I'm humbled by is why. Why did God see fit to save me? What did He see in me that was worth sending His Son to die for? The answer is both nothing, and everything. There is nothing good in me, or any of us. No one is good except God (Mark 10:18). That's the point. Except God. We were all destined for hell...except God came down from heaven and saved us. Now, when God looks at us, He doesn't see our past or our sins or our weakness; He sees Jesus, the perfect and blameless One. That's everything to Him, and it's everything for us.

So yes, we understand on an intellectual level the "why" of Easter. It was love that sent Jesus to the cross for us. But on an emotional level, it's hard to wrap our heads around. The good news is that God never asks us to fully understand it - we need only to receive it in faith. Often in Christianity we emphasize the wonderful things which God has revealed to us, and it is right to celebrate and marvel at those things. But equally important are the things which God has kept hidden from us - those "secret things" that belong to the Lord (Deut. 29:29). It is both confounding and liberating when we encounter questions that God has not revealed the answer to yet. In our impatience, we want to know now. But faith says that one day all will be revealed and "then I will know fully, even as I am fully known" (1 Corinthians 13:12).

I believe that heaven will be a continual celebration of discovery - that what was lost has been found, and what was hidden has been revealed. As we walk by faith, we anticipate the day when our faith will be made sight. Until then, embrace the unknown, wrestle with those questions - stand firm on the things which God has revealed, and treasure the anticipation of heavenly discovery.

Hot Dog Giveanlay


