



A Message from the Wing Commander: Col Kevin Berry

Just days before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in December 1941, concerned and visionary citizens founded the Civil Air Patrol and committed its members to employing civilian aviation resources to help bolster our nation's defense. Pennsylvanians, many from this area of our state, were among the first to step forward and volunteer to serve in this important new organization, and in Pennsylvania Wing.

Eight decades later, our dedicated volunteers continue that service to the Commonwealth, our communities and our nation! We have a rich history that began with members in local communities answering a call to serve their nation, and their neighbors, in a time of national need. Pennsylvania Wing, one of the original 48 Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Wings, has enabled everyday people to serve their fellow citizens in many meaningful ways for more than eighty years!!

Today, our missions and principles are quite similar to those we served on the day CAP was founded: December 1st 1941. Coastal and border patrols, search and rescue, natural disaster relief, air defense support and joint training with our military are all still in our mission portfolio. Deputy Adjutant General - Air


Brigadier General Michael J. Regan Jr. is the Deputy Adjutant General—Air for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He assumed his current duties on Sept. 26, 2016.

He serves as the primary advisor to The Adjutant General on all matters pertaining to air operations and as the commander of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard. He is responsible for the overall operational readiness of the 4,100 assigned members and for ensuring that they are trained and equipped to successfully accomplish their federal and state missions.

General Regan enlisted in the Air Force in October 1981 and transferred to the 111th Fighter Wing, Pennsylvania Air National Guard in February 1984. He was an Aircraft Weapons Specialist, Quality Assurance Specialist, Flight Chief and QA Chief. He attained the rank of Master Sergeant before being commissioned in 1994 as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. He held positions as a Flight, Squadron and Deputy Group Commander before serving most recently as the 111th Mission Support Group Commander.

General Regan has also served with the Michigan and Delaware Air National Guard. He has held various senior leadership roles in his civilian career, most recently as the Vice-President and Chief Information Officer at Lower Bucks County Hospital in Bristol, PA. Prior to that he held various management positions during his fifteen years with Siemens Medical Solutions in Malvern, PA. Most recently he was the Vice-President of Zone Services, responsible for the Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey regions. He was an adjunct profes-

Lt Col Stanton Altzman joined Civil Air Patrol as a cadet of Squadron 1016 in 1956. Rising to the grade of Cadet Captain and Cadet Commander. Lt Col Altzman was selected to attend the first Pennsylvania Wing Cadet Officer School. Lt Col Altzman's cadet achievements also include his attendance at 1958's International Air Cadet Exchange, serving as a cadet "ambassador" of goodwill in Spain. Lt Col Altzman's service continued in the United States Air Force where he served as an enlisted Airman from 1958 to 1964 while concurrently maintaining his membership in the Civil Air Patrol. After his National Service in the USAF, he returned to his home squadron as a senior member and commander of squadron 1016. In 1970 with the assistance of his wife, Lt Col Elizabeth Altzman they revitalized Squadron 1007 in Media PA and served in this unit until 1984 when he transferred to Group 100. While serving Group 100 he was in many different positions until Col MA Applebaum asked him to come to serve as the Pennsylvania Wing Chief of Staff.







The Gill Wilson Award Senior Professional Development Level 5 Award



The Gill Robb Wilson Award is the Civil Air Patrol's (CAP) highest award for Senior Member professional development. It recognizes senior members who have dedicated themselves to leadership and personal development in the CAP. [1] The CAP first gave this award in 1964 to honor the late Gill Robb Wilson. He is regarded as the founder of Civil Air Patrol, and served as CAP's first executive officer.

As members progresses through the program, they complete five increasingly complex training levels. Each level requires the member to become more involved in CAP activities, master skills in one of 23 technical areas, and develop leadership ability. As they complete these levels, the member receives awards, chances for promotion, and selection for more important roles within CAP.

The final milestone is the Wilson Award. It is earned after receiving the Paul E. Garber Award. In addition, members must direct the training of fellow members in a variety of courses. They must also have served in command or leadership positions for at least three years. Finally, they must have completed CAP's capstone course, the National Staff College, or approved equivalent. Recipients of this award, along with other requirements, makes a member eligible to the grade of CAP Lieutenant Colonel.

As CAP's premiere award for senior member professional development, the Gill Robb Wilson Award should be presented by an Air Force or CAP general officer, an elected state or federal official, or other distinguished person.

During the last two years, Civil Air Patrol's Safety Program has been revised. As a part of these changes, CAP Regulations 160-1 "Civil Air Patrol Safety Program" and 160-2 "Safety Reporting and Review" were adopted and published in late 2019.

Today's safety program emphasizes risk assessment and risk management. It recognizes that there is some risk in almost everything we do and identifying those risks ahead of time to determine whether what types and amounts of risk are acceptable, while maintaining the safety culture of Civil Air Patrol to the greatest extent.

While performing an assessment of the risks in any type of activity, the process has expanded to include everyone involved in an activity's input of any risks involved. Once this done and the appropriate CAPF 160 is completed, the activity is periodically monitored to verify that the safety measures put in place for the activity are effective and what, if anything, may need to be adjusted to enhance safety. As safety is everyone's responsibility, now everyone has the opportunity to be involved in the planning process as well.

Changes have also been made regarding mishaps and mishap reporting. While the basic requirements remain the same, as far as immediately reporting in eServices and follow up investigations, the emphasis today is placed on what factors and processes were involved and how to avoid them going forward. Process and equipment improvement as opposed to assigning responsibility or blame.

Safety is everyone's responsibility, and these changes will help ensure that everyone has a part in the safety program.

Please make sure you are entering mileage accurately, and keeping original paperwork in your van folders. This is required. Vans are also to be kept in a "mission ready" state.



PA WG supported the beginnings of the federal effort to get Americans vaccinated against COVID-19. As part of that, a FEMA led Vaccination Center was



GP3 further came to the aid of our home state when weather disasters struck Southeastern PA.

GP3 air and ground crews responded to tornadoes in Bucks County, aiding the PEMA mission.

When the remnants of Hurricane Ida struck, PA WG generated air and ground targets for PEMA, amassing over 2,083 images that were used by state and federal agencies to help determine the need for a federal disaster declaration request. Our communicators were impeccable at proactively providing support to all the CAP operations involved and ensuring phenomenal communications in cellular disrupted areas and tracking the status of our teams in the field.

At the start of 2021 Squadron 812 was holding meetings virtually. When we finally went in person attendance was very low. We're still trying to get cadets back. We had change of command On 1July2021. Squadron 812s command went from Capt Wilfong to 1st Lt. Wilfong. On 25Sept.2021 we had a few cadets Assist with parking in Limerick Twp. at the PA Fireman's Convention and parade. Capt. Weiss coordinated a trip to the Air Mobility Command Museum on Dover Air Force Base.





The ground teams and air sorties sent out by GP3 helped place PEMA, FEMA, and Philly OEM a full 48 hours ahead of their schedule!

PAWG flew 1,900 hrs this past fiscal year - an increase of 40% over last year. We were number 3 in the region behind NH WG and MA WG. We overflew our budget many times last year, yet we had ZERO budget refill requests denied.

Our budget has started becoming more stable and increased at both the state (PA DMVA) and federal (USAF) levels. For the first time, the USAF is including "sustainment" in their budget for us. This effects things like purchases of equipment for our aircraft to help with our missions, AND being able to keep them running, rather than cannibalizing or discarding broken equipment.

The number two pilot in the Wing (in terms of hours flown) was our very own 1st Lt Deep Damle from Squadron 1008! The plane with the most hours this past year was N99338, assigned to GP3! This definitely speaks to the efforts of Lt Col Bruce Thompson, 1st Lt Deep Damle, and all our orientation pilots getting that next generation of cadets interested in flight.

Finally, Major Tim Case led a Mission Pilot Ground School at Chester County to help train the next cohort of Mission Pilots. When these new Mission Pilots get fully qualified, we will be able to better train (and sustain!) more new aircrew to respond to our expanding array of missions.
