## ELEMENTARY PROGRAMS

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### Kindergarten—4th Grade

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#### TOO GOOD FOR VIOLENCE

Too Good builds protection within the student by providing opportunities for pro-social involvement, establishing positive norms including healthy beliefs and clear standards, promoting bonding to pro-social peers, and increasing personal and social skills

#### PROJECT TNT (Towards No Tobacco Use)

*Project TNT* is a ten-session, science-based program that is offered at the 5th grade level. In “TNT,” students learn the physical and social consequences of tobacco use. They also learn life skills such as listening, clear communication, and refusal skills. Students also learn about Media Literacy and how to critically examine advertising pitches used by the tobacco industry.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

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### SECOND STEP—GRADES 6 & 7

13—15 Lessons (45 minutes each)

Transitioning to middle school can be tough. The research-based *Second Step* program helps schools teach and model essential communication, coping, and decision-making skills that help adolescents navigate around the common pitfalls such as peer pressure, substance abuse, and bullying (both in-person and online). The outcome? Reduced aggression and support for a more inclusive environment that helps students stay in school, make good choices, and experience social and academic success.

### TOO GOOD FOR VIOLENCE—Grade 8

*Too Good for Violence* is a ten-lesson program that uses interactive games, role-plays, visual aids, and fun activities to teach and reinforce the social emotional skills students need to build pro-social relationships and make healthy choices. Students learn to set goals, make good decisions, manage emotions, effectively communicate, and how to apply these skills to conflict resolution, anger management, and bullying.



## HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS

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### CLASS ACTION

*Class Action* is a high school-based program that looks at the real-world social and legal consequences of underage alcohol use. The goal of this program is to change the social norms around alcohol use and to change negative peer pressure into positive peer pressure. In eight to ten weekly sessions (8-10 lessons, each lesson is 45 minutes), teens are divided into six legal teams to prepare and present hypothetical civil cases in which someone has been harmed as a result of underage drinking. The six cases are Drinking and Driving on Trial, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome on Trial, Drinking and Violence on Trial, Date Rape on Trial, Drinking and Vandalism on Trial, and School Alcohol Policies on Trial.
