


Mid-Winter Melbourne Cruise Trip Report, 16th- 17th July, 2022

Friday

The rest of the Crew wandered across to Sassone (a very nice Italian restaurant) a mere 50 metres from the end of the dock, where we enjoyed drinks and a magnificent meal. The restaurant staff were very accommodating and made up a round table for us making it very easy for us to converse during our time there.

Saturday

Sunday

After moving out into the Lake, a jubilee clip failed when Jay revved the engine to flush the motor. The failed clip allowed a hose to part from the engine which caused an unexpected, very thorough washing of the engine bay and surrounds. Jay has since replaced the hose and clip.

It was great few days with lots of catch ups and meeting of new friends. I would highly recommend a couple / few days at the Yarra's Edge Marine with trips up both the Yarra and Maribyrnong Rivers. Whilst the lounge and facilities are not quite the same as the MCM the staff were great and the facilities served their purpose.
