Stay safe on the roads over the holidays and every day!

- Prepare your car for winter and keep an emergency preparedness kit with you
- ♦ Leave early, planning ahead for heavy traffic
- Make sure every person in the vehicle is properly buckled up no matter how long or short the distance traveled
- Put that cell phone away; many distractions occur while driving, but cell phones are the main culprit
- Practice defensive driving
- Designate a sober driver to ensure guests make it home safely after a holiday party; alcohol or over -the-counter, prescription and illegal drugs can cause impairment


