# 'HEARTLESS': EXCERPT FROM PASTOR TOM'S SERMON

Kingdom of God citizens know there's "heart disease" in our nation.... There's heart disease in people when our hearts are not centered on God. When we selfishly center on ourselves, we become arrogant and diagnose everyone else's problems without looking at ourselves.

A great example of this is found in our political system. It's not only a matter of one person, but our president has forgotten the sacred trust bestowed upon him to be the moral leader and dutiful servant to the nation that elected him. We diagnose current and future suffering under this leadership.

When the decision of officials in power has been made to exploit and self-promote, we diagnose a part of the population will follow such leaders blindly. A forgetting about personal responsibility. Everything becomes the other person's fault. Without a sense of humility, honesty and willingness to seek an account of how others are affected, we find ourselves potentially becoming heartless, too.

Yet the kingdom of God remains in opposition to all that. And it remains because people have the ability to reject becoming abusers even when they are abused. There is a gift, a strength and a will to counter hate with love. Each of us holds an antidote for arrogance. A vaccine against false leaders to keep us from becoming blind and callous. God has made that antidote known to us through Jesus, who is the same yesterday, today and forever.

But I've felt more hopeful about our world ever since I subscribed to Fix the News, a weekly roundup of stories of progress. Interested? Billions of people have gained clean water, sanitation and hygiene in the last nine years. That's not a typo — that's billions, with a B. An astonishing new data dump from the WHO and UNICEF show[s] that between 2015 and 2024 humanity recorded one of the fastest expansions of basic welfare of all time: 961 million people gained safe drinking water, 1.2 billion gained safe sanitation, and 1.5 billion gained access to basic hygiene services, while the number of unserved fell by nearly 900 million. Coverage has risen to 74%, 58% and 80% respectively, while open defecation has dropped by 429 million people. Together, these figures represent an historic advance in human health and dignity.
