SUAKOKO SERAPHIM'S GIFT-WRAPPED JOY


At first blush, the setting looks bleak. The tile floors are crumbling, the windows masked by security grates. But at Saturday's dress rehearsal, the actors were entranced by their costume jewelry and pseudo-Palestinian headgear. "I have yet to have one of these kids confront me about scenery," said director Cassie Hammock, 47, a grandmother of four. "This is Broadway for these kids."...

Ten-year old Chris Mon had to confront the angelic host all alone, and he wasn't entirely faking it as he quaked with apprehension. "Looks like you're going to have to be all the shepherds," Hammock told him. "You're going to have to be a quick study." If any more cast members drop out, she joked, "The narrator will be saying a whole lot more than I had planned."

After a month of rehearsals, she was still exploring ways to dispose of the stuffing in Mary's belly at the proper moment. And she was still dispensing basic etiquette tips – like, you don't escort a pregnant woman by grabbing her arm.

But by the end of Saturday's final run-through, the angels were dancing and the cast was blowing spontaneous kisses. The only outcast was 12-year-old Michael Kemp, portraying evil King Herod. He had to be repeatedly shooed away from the joyful crowd in the stable....

And while she's still hoping for a last-minute donation of toys, Hammock will manage just fine if they don't materialize. After all, she proposed the pageant



as an antidote to commercial frenzy. The message of Christmas, she emphasized, is that hope and redemption occur in the midst of poverty: "Jesus – God – was born poor, but He continued to do good. And we still celebrate His life."


