A member of the congregation brought this to the attention of the Outreach Committee, so next month we're sponsoring a Diaper Drop. Children's diapers, sizes 2-6, are the most requested at various agencies. We'll collect

packages of diapers in the Rev. Emory Hingst Fellowship Hall through March 30, then we'll transport them to the Refuge House. Our partners and friends from New Mt. Zion AME Church will join us in collecting.



I've done some scouting. Dollar Tree has

packs of diapers for \$6, and recently Walgreens has had brand-name diapers (Pampers and Huggies) on sale.

unfamiliar with Manna? Below is some information forwarded to us by Shellie Camp, who is Faith Presbyterian's Manna liaison. (Faith is right across the street from St. Stephen.)

Manna on Meridian is a volunteer-driven, community-based food pantry dedicated to fighting food insecurity in Tallahassee. With an annual budget of around \$70,000, Manna operates through the generous support of five partner churches, over 200 volunteers, and countless donors who believe in nourishing both body and spirit. We are proud to partner with <u>Second Harvest of</u> the Big Bend to extend our reach and impact.

- Walk-up Choice Pantry: Sundays, noon-1 p.m. offering fresh produce and baked goods donated by local retailers.
- Main Drive-thru Distribution: 3rd Saturday of each month, 8-9:30 a.m.

 - * Sundays: Publix (#1836) pick-up, Trader Joe's pickup, setup and distribution.

Here's a look at the scope of this undertaking: In Phase I, the men in the village dug a well 75 feet deep and hit surface water. They built a storage tank there to hold a large amount of water and piping to a number of smaller tanks at homes in the village. Those small tanks are shared between several families. In the dry season, though, that well dries up. The women in the village hike a mile to the river, fill containers, then carry them home. So the next phase of the project is to drill 600 feet deep to hit an aquifer that will not go dry - and to extend the piping and storage tanks to a number of additional homes. Total budget: \$25,000. Maybe we can help.

PASTOR TOM'S WELCOME NOTES FROM LAST SUNDAY

In your youth, you may have been like me and joked from time to time about this existential question: "Why am I here?" It might have occurred when gazing up at the stars or considering a career. As we age, the question becomes less of a joke.

As we gather today in the midst of a shrinking institutional church, I'm now seriously asking the question: "Why are we here?" If you weren't forced to be here, perhaps you came for relationship, healing, education or presence. Maybe for all of them? It's important to name the reason.

I'm coming to see that we cannot separate personal healing from societal healing. One cannot occur without the other. When I say "I must sweep my own doorstep before my neighbor's," then I've separated personal healing from societal healing. They must happen together. May I suggest that to be why we are here?
