Our annual Ministry of Reconciliation celebration is this Sunday! The flyer above gives you all of the details. The topic for keynote speaker Jonathan Webber, who's with the Southern Poverty Law Center, is "The Politics of Possibility: Inspiring Hope in Times of Challenge." Here in inauguration week, we're well aware that we live in times of challenge. But we soldier on! As you prepare for Sunday's activities, here are some last-minute thoughts from organizer Dave Suhrweir:

The potluck luncheon should include some vegetarian, vegan and glutenfree items for those with restricted diets. If you're inclined to provide such food, please provide labels identifying them as such.



- We anticipate that a substantial number of visitors may attend. Because parking space is limited, church members who are not mobility-challenged are encouraged to park in the office-complex lot behind the church building. - We should make a special effort to greet visitors to make them feel welcome. We should also help visitors seated nearby with use of the church bulletin and finding hymns in the red hymnal.

EXCERPTS FROM PASTOR TOM'S SERMON

... [Jan. 19 was] Martin Luther King Jr. Day and also Inauguration Day.... Maybe it's a sign to have these two things occur on the same day? In [the Gospel of] John, signs always point to God or God's abundant grace upon grace. And, for us who remain attentive and follow Jesus' directions, there must be an attentive witness and a readiness to step up to God's justice.

For while we are Americans, we are first Jesus Followers who freely proclaim that no matter who is being inaugurated, the church's calling remains the same. The values we hold as Christ's Followers, love, equality, justice, bravery, will continue to be lived out boldly and distinctively.

For it may seem that, sometimes, our wine has run out, but then something amazing happens ... a sign ... a miracle ... and suddenly God's Word is right there accompanying us in our call. It's no wonder, then, that this account begins with the words "On the third day there was a wedding." On the third day Jesus rose from the dead. With Jesus around, every day is the third day. With Jesus around, we find miracles occurring every day. Even minor ones bring significant

transformations, if we have eyes to see them.

When such moments happen, we find that the event is significant, but what happens in the midst of the event is even more important – because that's when the sign from heaven turns us around to see an

outrageous and overflowing God of grace upon grace.
