My recent doctor's visit showed that my blood markers are still low. Full remission probably isn't likely. I learned that it isn't expected in "elderly Acute Myeloid Leukemia."

The goal now is for me to have a good quality of life for as long as possible. That means I probably won't travel far or be in public without a mask, but I can still have visits from friends, do errands, go out to lunch occasionally, come to church on occasion — especially when there are special events, etc. I just have to be very careful in crowds, as I can't be touched due to the risk of infection.



In addition to having in-person visits, I have lots of friends who communicate regularly by text or phone, & Greta is great company. Life is good, and I am grateful!

'LET GO': PASTOR TOM'S WELCOME FROM LAST SUNDAY

One doesn't need to look far these days to see that there's a vicious anger in our world. One group is angry at another, while the other is equally angry at their opposites. We're angry at injustice and evil, which we ought to be. We're angry at people's selfishness and immaturity, which is necessary.

Yet this anger, this anger, takes us away from equity and freedom sometimes. It leads us instead to an impatience in us. It leads us instead to need to humiliate our opponents at times, and when our anger gets like that, then we enter that vicious cycle of hurt and hate. If left unchecked, that anger is going to cripple you. It's going to cripple me. Just like the woman in the Gospel who was doubled over, our fury can double us over, bend our backs. It will possess us like a demon if we let it.

So today, beloved, let's let go of the ego inside us that leads us to one-up our oppressors. Let us let go of that ego and cycle of anger that is so easy to fall into, where violence and hatred become the norm. Instead, let us stand in the Presence, letting Jesus heal us, so that we can stand upright.
