THE LEGALITY AND JUSTICE OF SAME-SEX MARRIAGE

St. Stephen's annual "celebration of God's inclusive love," organized once again by Dave Suhrweir, is scheduled for Jan. 29. As always, Ministry of Reconciliation Sunday promises to be memorable – with worship, lunch and a compelling guest speaker.

"Listening to Dr. Martin Luther and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr." is the title of the keynote address. Professor Robert Atkinson, of FSU's College of Law, will focus on the legality and justice of same-sex marriage. He's the faculty advisor for the



FSU law-student organization OUTLaw, which promotes education and discussion about legal issues facing the LGBTQ+ community, and advocates respect and equality for LGBTQ+ within the university setting and beyond. (This Sunday's Noisy Offering will benefit OUTLaw. During next Sunday's Ministry of Reconciliation event, there will be other opportunities to make free-will donations.)

The liturgy, of course, will begin at 10 a.m. in the sanctuary. Professor Atkinson will speak next. Then comes lunch in the fellowship hall. Next week's newsletter will include a copy of a flyer Dave has created for the event, with more details. In the meantime, see Dave if you have any questions – and thank him for his many years of putting these meaningful programs together.

A MESSAGE OF HOPE

... [Tallahassee volunteer Kim Shields] has come to know addicts and exoffenders, as well as middle-class families reeling from job loss or medical woes. She's haunted by the memory of one 30-year-old homeless woman who tried so hard to make it on fast-food wages.


"She had just had a hysterectomy three weeks before. She was willing to go to work even though she wasn't supposed to – anything to get money coming in. We tried to find her a place to stay.... It just seemed like everything was against her."

Shields worked with that woman for four months before losing touch. "That was probably my first lesson in discouragement. I can plant that seed, but I can't necessarily be there to see the harvest, the end of the picture."

Sometimes, all she can offer is the message that somebody cares.

"I want to show them Jesus, really.... I know that, if God wasn't in my life, I'd just go back to my old ways. I would just slip back into it. I think people need God – He is our saving hope. When you know God, you look at your problems differently."

REACHING OUT

Here's a reminder of items we're collecting for various community groups:

 Toilet paper and toiletries, for distribution at the Kearney Center. (Place them in the tub in the fellowship hall, through Jan. 27.)
