#### ALSO AT THE MEETING...

- The congregation enthusiastically approved a 2022 budget that includes a 7-percent raise for Pastor Tom.
- "We're in good standing," Treasurer Jen Dritt said in describing St. Stephen's financial condition. She didn't have yearend statements to hand out, she said, because she's still waiting for a few items so she can close the books on 2021. (You'll receive a copy of that yearend breakdown soon.)
- We also learned that a piece of Pastor Tom's compensation goes toward paying off his seminary loan – and that any of us can make donations specifically for that purpose.
- With gratitude, we approved a new endowment set up by an unnamed St.
   Stephen couple. The interest it generates will go toward peace and justice initiatives in our community. In the coming year, a committee of St. Stephen members will be formed to oversee that spending.
- We also heartily approved Sue Canning, Mark Canning and Jonas Holdcraft as our Synod Assembly delegates.



Val Sullivan spoke for all of us when she praised our "structurally sound and beautiful" worship space. And she thanked the building and design committee that wrestled with the million and one decisions involved.

Denise Bookwalter, our newly elected president, led that committee – which consisted of Pastor Tom, David Butler, Mark

Bertolami, Ann Hingst, Jim Sampson, Margaret Bowers and Mark Greeley (aka Denise's husband).

"Thank you for the honor of serving as your president," Val said in closing.
 Referring to her Council colleagues, she said, "What a strong group of people!"

### A LONG, LONG WAY FROM SYRIA

New residents in Tallahassee come via many roads - university students, job

opportunities, being closer to family and, most recently, with the help of the International Rescue Committee. The IRC helps refugees not only from Afghanistan but also from other parts of the world.

Recently our education coordinator, Rita Ford, met a family here from Syria. In true teacher fashion, Rita and her family have taken these new residents under their wing. The family consists of Dad, Mom and three boys, ages 12, 10 and 2½.



The children won't attend local schools until their English proficiency improves. Some specific items they need:

- Gently used books picture, primary, board and early readers, graphic novels.
- Gently used or new workbooks or activity books for children. Dollar Tree has a good selection.
- Size 4 diapers.
- A computer so the boys can do online school in anticipation of learning English and going to a brick-and-mortar school. You can send a donation to church earmarked "Computer for Syrian family."
- Gently used games or toys.
- Cleaning supplies and toiletries.

Bring your items to church in a bag marked with Rita's name and placed it in the kitchen and she will gladly deliver it.



One more thing from Outreach: We continue to collect items for the Going Places Street Outreach Center. Toiletries, snacks, warm shirts, pants and socks are needed – along with detergent, so clients living on the street can come to the center and wash their clothes. We truly make a difference in the lives of young people in our community.

... The worship community of St. Stephen has experienced disruption but NOT

disintegration. For this, we can hold our heads up. We have continued to worship the One True God and have been good stewards with our resources. The Gospel is preached and the sacraments are administered faithfully. Through generous giving of time, talent and treasure we have been blessed to be on the verge of wrapping up a major capital campaign in the sanctuary. St. Stephen successfully gave 9% of her collections to the larger church. We met our obligations to the variety of nonprofit organizations that we support and lift up. We even took on a few new missions when other entities



reached out for help. We have been open for the homeless visitors who have come to Bible study and to worship. These and others have sought emergency help ... with food and gas....

My prayer is that we will soon be able to be together in person. Such a day brings me joy to think about, but until it comes we will be faithful stewards and follow health guidelines while praising a God that never fails us. We look forward with hope and anticipation to what God has in store for the faithful and for the new relationships we will form in 2022!
