FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT FOR JANUARY

For the month of January, our total income was \$18,768, and our total expenses were \$20,185. So, at month's end, we were under our budget projection by \$1,417. As of Wednesday (Feb. 7), our checking account balance was \$4,662.

The congregation gave \$175 to Manna on Meridian and \$1,115 to Pastor's Justice and Mercy Account. Those figures are not included in the above financial summary.

KEEPING UP-TO-DATE WITH ST. STEPHEN OUTREACH

Outreach encompasses our daily prayers and gifts for those in need locally, nationally and internationally. And we on the Outreach Committee have a NEW initiative to announce. Beginning this Sunday, we'll have a collection tub in the fellowship hall to support the closet at Common Ground Book Store, 128 N. Bronough St. The LGBTQ+-friendly store doesn't need clothing currently, but it does need accessories, shoes (men's/women's), hygiene products, hair products and new makeup. Cassandra White will make deliveries once a month. Common Ground is open noon-8 p.m. Tuesday-Saturday and noon-6 p.m. Sunday.

Now, here are reminders of our other outreach opportunities:

- The Pastor's Justice and Mercy Account allows Pastor Tom to provide vital assistance to those with housing or food insecurity. You can participate by including a monetary gift with your regular offering or via Venmo, or with Publix, Target, Walmart or gas gift cards.
- We continue to support the local International Rescue Committee as it welcomes and resettles refugees from around the world. In a tub in the fellowship hall, we collect items such as laundry detergent, cleaning spray, toilet cleaner, toilet-bowl brushes, cleaning rags/towels, dishes, pots and pans, cutlery, sheets (twin/full/queen), blankets and personal-hygiene items. Contact me if you have baby/toddler clothes and equipment or children's books/games to donate, and I'll deliver them. (Please note: IRC is not collecting adult clothing or large furniture now.)





- St. Stephen continues to support Lutheran Social Services' KidSafe program via a yearly designated budget gift. In addition, you may designate specific gifts to KidSafe through Venmo or your offering envelope.
- Additional support continues for the Manna on Meridian food pantry through your generous monetary and food donations. Help us fill the tub in the fellowship hall with T-shirts, which will be refurbished into reusable Manna shopping bags.
- Ministry Minute is our once-a-month opportunity for members to learn about community outreach initiatives that may inspire the gift of your money or time. One example is the Seminole Manor Neighborhood Food Pantry. Not only were we able to provide clothing, blankets and sleeping bags, but also a group of intrepid St. Stephen gardeners and builders helped provide repairs to windows, doors and grounds there.

- Giving Tree (December).

EXCERPT FROM PASTOR TOM'S SERMON

Think of a time in your life when you said these words: "And so it begins." That would be a time when you saw something or did something or decided something, and then came those words: "And so it begins." Was it the decision to go or not go to college? Was it the time you decided to take a career path or change one that you'd been on? Maybe it was a decision to go into the military or maybe leave it when the time came. A decision to have children or to not have children. In all of these real-life decisions there was a new start; a turning of the page in life; and a new path was becoming your adventure....

Since we come off a week where we just had two funeral services right here at St. Stephen, and another the Saturday before at Culley's Cemetery for a dear member whose father died, we are mindful of other ways our pages in life are turned. When a loved one dies we are forced to evaluate what comes next, to struggle through new responsibilities, new roles, and doing it all while deeply grieving. We become part of a club that each and every one of us will belong to if we live long enough. A grief club, a survivors' club, an "And so it begins" club.

Whatever we call it, Jesus is there in the private and the public spaces. Whatever we call it, Jesus is wanting to proclaim a message to you and to me. A message of unity and partnership and healing ... and a message of serving, because that was what he came to do.
