"It has become an outlet as well as a ministry for me," Colleen said. "Before performing, I feel both nervous and excited. When it's over, my heart is beating from the exercise as well as the overwhelming feeling of the Holy Spirit empowering us." WE'RE THINKING OF YOU, GORDON



St. Stephen members. The Syrian family we've told you about has received a computer for the school-aged boys to work on their English, thanks to our members and the Muslim community. Additionally, they've received pots and pans, books and school supplies. Ongoing needs are size-4 diapers, gently used board games and toys for the 2½-year-old (also a boy).

The International Rescue Committee (IRC) continues to collect items to help refugees from around the world – and has set up an Amazon wish list. No, you don't have to buy from Amazon. You may buy them elsewhere or even donate gently used items from the list instead. If you DO order from Amazon, you can have them delivered directly to IRC at 1310 Cross Creek Circle, Suite A, Tallahassee, FL 32310. If you buy items locally, you can mark them for IRC and leave them in the fellowship hall for me to deliver. We continue to support the Going Places Street Outreach Center with snacks, period supplies, socks, gloves, hats, long-sleeve shirts, sweatshirts, toiletries and detergent. Justin Barfield, from Capital City Youth Services, picked up last week's donation and was most appreciative.

Last thing: Pastor Tom got an update from Pastor Balde at Tallahassee's Haitian church on the efforts to provide affordable housing in Haiti. Because of unrest and violence, the building project is on hold. The 16 boxes of supplies gathered by St. Stephen have been shipped to the Haitian congregation's connections in Haiti. The leftover money was returned for future needs in the Haitian community.


