Ash Wednesday is next week! And so we prepare for another Lenten journey.



As always, Pastor Tom and the worship team are figuring out how best to observe each new season in the time of COVID. And they're being creative. Pastor Tom plans to be at church next Wednesday between noon and 1 p.m., with mask on and ashes in hand, ready to impose those ashes on any masked member or friend who drives through the parking lot.

For those who can't make it, he's offering an alternative: "If you wish to participate at home with ashes, please stop by the church ahead of time to pick them up. They will be available starting tomorrow (Friday) in a basket outside by the office entry door. I will keep them stocked until Wednesday."

Of course, there will also be an Ash Wednesday liturgy, live-streamed the same as on Sunday mornings – beginning at 6 p.m. No, it won't be the same as our traditional in-person services. But in a way it's even more special, because it's custom-designed to meet our needs in this unprecedented time. It's a reminder of the ways in which God seeks us out wherever we are, whatever we're going through.

With a broken heart I'm sad to say that my beautiful, loving and spunky mom,


Cootie Rhodes, passed away Jan. 26. A graveside service will be held in Jacksonville at a later date.


