Who knew that a parking lot could be a sacred space? That's what it became yesterday, when people arrived between noon and 1 p.m. for the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. It was much more than a quick drive-through experience.

"Since it was such a nice day, people chose to get out of their cars," Audrey Post, one of the participants, said in an email. "Pastor read the prayer of the day each time and imposed the ashes and addressed each worshipper by name, saying, 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.'"

Pastor Tom was delighted with the rare opportunity to spend face-to-face time with St. Stephen people during this Zoom era.

"What a foretaste for when we can gather again!" he said afterward. "With joy, 14 folks (including two new faces) came to the parking lot to

'I AM NOT INDESTRUCTIBLE': EXCERPTS FROM PASTOR TOM'S FEB. 7 SERMON

"... When I was a teenager, many years ago, I thought I was indestructible. Like most at that age, I thought tragedies happen to other people, but then I almost killed myself while snow skiing. At a picturesque resort in Lake Tahoe called Heavenly Valley, I ... hit a vicious patch of ice and collided with a tree. The tree won. Three to four days later I woke up in the hospital with the knowledge quite literally pounded into my head ... I am not indestructible.



"Looking back now, I see that I was made to understand that truth the hard way. A page turned in my life that allowed me to realize how fragile life is and how my behavior affects the life of other people. A page is turned in life when we understand that everything can change in a flash. Continued on pg. 3

"Another example was when we left Kennesaw, Georgia, to move down to Largo, Florida. As we pulled away from the home where Davis and Wesley were born, we left stable careers knowing that there was a void in our lives. At such times, we are often brought to prayer, and I made one to God. A deal from a desperate man: 'God if you can get us moved safely and settled into a new area, I will make it a priority to finally find a church community to belong to.' We drove away, and again the page was turned...." [And St. Stephen Lutheran Church history was changed, too, Pastor Tom.]
