- THE VAL REPORT (as of Wednesday afternoon): Our dear president, Val Sullivan, has had some struggling days and nights, but her last procedure is showing good progress. They removed her from the ECMO bypass machine. Doctors and nurses plan to monitor her lung strength and remove the breathing tube next. They will give her a temporary trachea tube in case her lungs tire and she requires oxygen. This way, Val will not need to be re-intubated and she can be brought out of heavy sedation. Keep those prayers for healing coming!
- COOTIE'S REHAB: Our beloved "Cootie" Rhodes encountered a hip fracture. She
  is currently in rehab following surgery to repair the fracture. Please keep her in
  your prayers and send a note of "Get well soon!" to daughter Betty Wilder for

- TWINS ON THE WAY: Thank you for your prayers for Erin and Eric McClanahan!

#### SPECIAL WHEELS FOR A DEAR ST. STEPHEN FRIEND

It's been about a month since our annual Ministry of Reconciliation Sunday. I'm thankful that I worship in a church that welcomes absolutely all, and in particular our LGBTQ siblings in Christ, to be part of our community. I'm thankful that the ELCA voted 10 years ago to "allow" ordination of LGBTQ candidates who were in committed relationships.



It wasn't always so. In 1992, St. Stephen welcomed Robin Whitley as our vicar for a year. Shortly after she arrived, our daughter Rebecca was born and Vicar Robin was the first visitor we had at the hospital. She rejoiced with us as she held our hours-old baby. A couple months later, our 5-year-old, Thomas, struggled with the death of his beloved Grampy. Vicar Robin sat with him on the steps to the fellowship

hall one evening and talked with him at length about life and death. Thomas healed some that night and we were grateful. In 1995, Robin was ordained (after a long wait for a congregation to take a chance on a recent graduate – and a woman!) at a church in North Carolina as many of us proudly looked on, knowing she would enrich the life of the church she served, much as she had enriched St. Stephen with her music, sermons, poetry and love. Two years later, needing to live an authentic life, Robin came out to her bishop as gay. She was removed from her call and the ELCA roster.

Robin now is a writer and artist living in North Carolina. She lives on disability income and budgets carefully for her condo payment, medical bills and other living expenses. When the choice came down to medicine or the upkeep of a vehicle, she reluctantly gave up her vehicle. Now, in an effort to restore mobility, she has worked with a cycle shop in Charlotte and found a motorized tricycle that will work for her (and her beloved companion dog, Birdie). I started a Go Fund Me campaign months ago to raise the \$3,000 needed, and we still need \$1,255. The trike has now been ordered on faith and will be delivered in about two weeks. I ask you, in the spirit of reconciliation, to consider a donation to our beloved Vicar Robin. Here's the link.
