

# THIS MONTH'S NOISY OFFERING GOES TO...

You know those physician assistants in your doctor's office? Did you ever wonder where they were trained? Maybe it was right here at FSU's College of Medicine – where community outreach and "serving the underserved" is a high priority, as it is at St. Stephen. That's why St. Stephen Outreach Coordinator Sharon Simmons invited a College of Medicine PA faculty member to be our Ministry Minute speaker last Sunday.

Assistant Professor Allison Justice advises the student-led program called HOME Street Medicine. Established in 2022, it's designed for "Bridging the gap for our unhoused neighbors." HOME, by the way, stands for Homeless Outreach Medicine and Education.

"We engage with the unsheltered population where they live, building relationships, offering companionship and respect, performing health screenings, and directing them to primary care follow-up available with community health centers throughout Leon County," according to the notes that Allison sent us Monday. "Our success has been the result of the continued passion of the students and faculty as well as collaboration with partners within and outside of FSU's [PA program], such as Kearney Center outreach workers, the Leon County Sheriff's Office and community health clinics.

"Based on the community needs determined by Kearney Center social workers, the health-care team enters encampments around the county to provide screenings and basic first-aid care. Based on the discussions we have with populations in these encampments, we relay their specific needs to our community partners to support basic needs. These rounds have identified unmet health-care needs, which have underscored the true need for our services."

Later in their training, these PA students will continue to provide care at FSU's regional campuses across the state. "Exposure to the unsheltered population within their community and their environment allows the future clinicians to develop compassion for the underserved population and encourages them to be more mindful of their unique needs," Allison wrote. "Subsequently, clinicians who have been a part of HOME Street Med may better care for these communi-

ties."
