THERE'S GOOD NEWS IN OUR LATEST FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

In my effort last month to keep everyone updated on our financials, I forgot to include two important platforms for giving to St. Stephen: Venmo and Vanco. Venmo is the newest way to give, and we receive its totals a day after the month ends. Vanco is an automatic gift-giving platform that comes directly to St. Stephen but isn't included on the weekly counter's reports. Therefore I have good news, and a couple of corrections for our January and February collections.

- JANUARY Total income: \$19,894. Total expenses: \$19,876. So income was ABOVE expenses by \$18 (NOT below by \$6,142 as reported earlier). **Big difference!**
- FEBRUARY Total income: \$15,908. Total expenses: \$18,222. So income was below expenses by \$2,314 (NOT below by \$11,896 as reported earlier).
- MARCH Total income: \$24,856. Budgeted expenses: \$21,684. So income was ABOVE expenses by \$3,172.

The trend for the first quarter of the year is hugely encouraging. So far, collections exceed expenses by \$876. Thank God for your faithful giving!

SANCTUARY DOLLARS

The repair and renovation of the sanctuary is officially complete! Good people of St. Stephen, without one another we couldn't have accomplished it. The total cost was \$192,413. That's below the estimate because some projected work on the foundation wasn't needed, nor was an electrical job. We raised \$206,449 for the project, leaving us \$14,036 in the black!

So what's the plan for the remaining money? Collections for new chairs have slowed. So far we have roughly half of the necessary \$8,054, so we could use part of the \$14,036 to pay that off. Some hope to use the surplus to put new glass in the oval window at the back of the sanctuary and replace the protective glass on the exterior of the stained glass in front. Whatever happens, your dollars will go toward the sanctuary - since that's where you intended them to qo.

YOU, TOO, COULD BE AN ACOLYTE OR...

There's always someone at church who inspires us to say, "How would we get along without X?" Certainly one of our X's now is Beth Alexander. Acolyte, crucifer, assisting minister, lector, Altar Guilder, Church Council member – she can do it all! But she doesn't want to do it all by herself. She could use a new batch of volunteers. Maybe even you.

Now that we're moving away from stripped-down COVID liturgies, we can use

new acolytes. Someone has to light those candles and extinguish them every Sunday. Often it's a role that our younger members fill, but older acolytes are equally welcome.

Crucifer is another role. That's the person who holds the cross aloft and leads the procession to the front of the sanctuary. This job requires muscle, because the cross is quite top -heavy. Sound like something for you?



A young person who wanted to ease into the role might team up with a parent at first. Maybe you?

Some people have been acolyte and crucifer simultaneously, as Beth was last Sunday. Sometimes, we've had the cup minister also serve as acolyte and crucifer. Yes, we can always use more cup ministers, too, and assisting ministers. And we've barely even mentioned the Altar Guild – which, over the years, has been a great way for newer members to get involved. And new leaders to shine.
