KEEPING UP WITH THE SANCTUARY PROJECT

 The Building and Design Committee is hard at work, ironing out details to present to general contractors.

- An architect fee of \$11,000 has been paid. The remaining \$9,000 will be paid upon completion of the architect's work.
- Financial gifts contributed toward the sanctuary repair and other renovations now total \$130,900. On top of that, \$14,850 has been pledged.
- If you haven't had an opportunity to make a gift or pledge yet, please prayerfully consider doing so and be sure to designate it to the Capital Campaign for the Sanctuary Project.

"We're both on the Community Remembrance Project (CRP)," Pastor Tom said. In fact, Byron is now the CRP chair. They're both also involved with the newly forming Capital Area Justice Ministry. "We hit it off right away and further worked together in advocacy doing Zoom meetings with City Manager Reese Goad and presenting before the mayor and at City Commission meetings," Pastor said.

It's possible that St. Stephen will be seeing more of Byron – and his sisters and brothers at St. Michael. "The potential of bringing our churches together for fellowship or ministry was lifted up between each of us, after COVID restrictions are lifted," Pastor Tom said. "I hoped that our invitation to preach may help him with his calling to ordained ministry. He appreciates prayers during this time."

NOW, ABOUT THAT WEDDING...

Let's also say a few prayers for Davis and Lily Holdcraft, the newlyweds who live

in Port Orange. Davis teaches flying at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, where Lily works remotely as a graphic design professional. Pastor Tom officiated, Wesley was his brother's best man and little brother Jonas was a groomsman.
