A CLOSER LOOK AT OUR NUMBERS

St. Stephen's financial report to close out 2021 revealed positive ministry activity. The congregation took in a total of \$380,766. That figure includes regular giving and designated giving, along with dividends and the columbarium. Let's dig in a little further:

- Designated giving for the property and building fund in 2021 was \$145,280.
- Seed money for a Mission Endowment Fund was given to St. Stephen in the amount of \$25,000 – and our endowment team is working with the ELCA Foundation to get those funds invested, so they can be used for peace and justice ministries.
- We collected a little over \$5,000 for Manna on Meridian and over \$6,000 for the Pastor's Justice and Mercy Fund, for a total of \$11,102. The Mission Outreach (including Manna, Lutheran Social Services of North Florida, and Justice and Mercy) spent a penny under \$15,010. We went over our budgeted and collected funds for these ministries by \$1,408.
- Mission support to the Florida-Bahamas Synod totaled \$18,550.


Total expenses for 2021 were \$392,985. As noted at the top, we took in \$380,766. That means we finished the year in the red by \$12,219. Yes, at first glance that deficit for 2021 may appear concerning. But listen to this: The deficit was absorbed by the collections we received the previous year. That is, we ended 2020 with a large surplus in the funds we collected for the sanctuary renovation. We're working to finalize past financial statements so we can provide year-to-year comparisons for total income and expenses.

As always, the Church Council and I thank you for your stewardship and trust in using your financial gifts for God's will and God's purposes in Tallahassee and beyond.

EXCERPT FROM SUNDAY'S SERMON

"Everything behind the scenes of this section of John's Gospel [10:22-30] hinges on the temple leadership's response when Jesus healed a blind man on the Sabbath. They were unwilling to 'see' the miraculous event of a man who physically could not 'see' but now does. The healed blind man sees with his eyes and sees who Jesus is and then becomes a follower. In other words, some who could physically 'see' remained blind to Jesus' identity. Irony makes for a meaningful story.

"You know what else is ironic? Some people's understanding of Revelation – that the book is to be decoded to tell us what's going to happen in the future. The truth is that the letter we call 'Revelation' was written to seven churches along the western coast of Turkey.... [It] speaks to every church of every generation that requires encouragement to stand apart from Christian nationalism, racism, and supremacist behavior."
