THE TRAVELING TANGERINE TREE

Wonder where the Sugar Belle Tangerine tree from the church courtyard went? You don't have to look very far. It's now the centerpiece for the newly expanded pollinator garden located at the southwest corner of the property, where the classroom building and fellowship hall meet. Its spring bloom was quite beautiful and fragrant. It now shares its blossoms with a variety of pollinating plants that attract butterflies, bees and hummingbirds.

You'll also notice the beginnings of a new garden on the north lawn (near Pinewood Drive). Curved benches will serve as the centerpiece for the garden.

'YOU GIVE US HOPE': EXCERPT FROM SUNDAY'S SERMON

In his sermon about the Holy Trinity, Pastor Tom added this and other material to "The Letter to Nicodemus," by Claudio Carvalhaes.

"... Our world now is one that loves guns, money and selfish power more than it loves God. And our water is drying up, too. All of these things have happened because we have turned our backs on the Spirit of God.

"Yet we are like you, Nicodemus, and we do not give up on pursuing a relationship with Jesus. You came back to Him and became a public follower who took risks for the sake of the Gospel. You give us hope that we can do that, too – hope that a new birth is about to begin in our world.

"And people are coming together to stand up with the righteous power to change hurtful policies and sideline corporate greed. You see, we know that the people have the power, and many are becoming open to believe again in an active and loving God who desires us to know we are born of the Spirit...."
