'NONES,' 'DONES' AND US

The Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly in Kissimmee was a workshop assembly.

There was business to deliberate and vote on, but there were also breakout workshops and a phenomenal keynote speaker who taught us in worship and lecture. His name is the Rev. Dr. Rafael Malpica Padilla, and he serves as executive director of global missions for the ELCA.

He spoke about the realities of church decline and began by pointing to the "nones" and the "dones." We all know about the numbers of people who describe themselves as "nones." Those are the ones who say "none" when asked what faith tradition they belong to. The "dones" are those who grew up or spent a large part of their life in a congregation – until something happened, and they left. They're "done" with the church. We all know of people who fit in each category.

Through a study of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, the Rev. Malpica Padilla encouraged us to work on church health. To look at the ways our congregation is, or is not, open and inclusive. To consider the ways that the mission of Jesus is (or is not) the mission of the congregation and then let the mission of Jesus Christ define our church. This is foundational to church health.

You may feel that St. Stephen is in good health according to the points our



guest speaker made, but we too have challenges in the new landscape of the church. Our mission is not to simply get people into the pews, but to bring good news to the poor. What are the things we should deconstruct? What boundaries might we cross with compassion? How is Jesus disturbing our comforts? Most of us know what a special place St. Stephen is. It shouldn't be kept a secret.

- Hello, St. Stephen! Here are some updates from Manna on Meridian.
- We're welcoming Caroline Collins aboard to help with Manna duties for St. Stephen.
- Volunteer opportunities now exist on Sundays and Fridays as well as the Saturday distribution. Friday is set-up, and Sunday is bread-and-baked-goods distribution, which is really popular.



- Manna is now tracking volunteer hours to help with grant applications.
- Some items that Manna specifically needs donated are:
 - ♦ 16- to 18-ounce boxes of cereal (something on the healthier side, like corn flakes or Cheerios).
 - Basic canned soups (tomato, vegetable, chicken noodle), especially those with pop tops.
