

Now there's one more area of visual interest on the grounds of St. Stephen. This copper art piece was donated by Marilyn Larson, and David Butler has incorporated it in a new succulent garden tucked between the sanctuary entrance and the stairs leading to the fellowship hall. The artwork, which Marilyn calls "Tri-Cross," belonged to the late Fleet Pride, her life partner and an enthusiastic participant in many St. Stephen programs. It had been hanging in her home since the late 1980s. "Fleet's ashes are in the columbarium," Marilyn said, "and now the art piece that originally belonged to him is nearby." She recalls that the artist was Gay Drennon. We're trying to track down whether Gay is still alive and still living in this area, perhaps with a different last name. 
