A FINAL SALUTE TO JERRY NESS

When Jerry Ness greeted you, his big paw swallowed up your hand. He smiled at you with shy eyes and spoke quietly in that deep, rich voice of his. Since 1978, St. Stephen has been blessed to have Jerry and his wife, Sandy, as



members. But as Pastor Tom announced last Sunday, Jerry passed away July 24. He was 85. This is a lovely line from his obituary: "Jerry always had a smile on his face, and everyone became his friend."


His final resting place is a place of honor, reserved for a chosen few. A graveside service with full military honors will be held at 10 a.m. Monday, Aug. 15, at **Tallahassee National Cemetery on** Apalachee Parkway.

Gerald Arthur Ness was a kid of 18 when he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. That was the beginning of a 26-year career as a chief hospital corpsman. Over those years

he was stationed many places, but he especially enjoyed his time in Bahrain and in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. His final orders brought him to Tallahassee, where he later retired. This is where he and Sandy raised their two kids, Eric (who lives in Sweden) and Jennifer (who lives here in town). And now there are five grandchildren: Katie (Washington, D.C.), Jack (Charleston, S.C.), Cole (Tallahassee), Emelie (Sweden) and Ellinor (Sweden).

Jerry and Sandy - who both grew up in Minneapolis, and married 55 years

ago – have been such a blessing to St. Stephen. Here's a glimpse of their church life from a 1998-99 congregational directory: "Both of them take their turn counting financial contributions on Sundays. Jerry also sweeps the sidewalks. Sandy sends baptism and birthday cards, is a gift presenter and is a fellowship hostess....



They write: 'Both of us enjoy people. It's a good feeling to make a difference in someone's life."

Jerry's obituary showed us how he continued to make new friends. "In lieu of flowers," it read, "the family requests memorial donations to Sweat Therapy Fitness, 1122 Thomasville Road, Tallahassee, FL 32303. Please write 'RSB Scholarship Fund' in the memo line. Jerry enjoyed his Rock Steady Boxing classes, which were instrumental in helping him live with Parkinson's. He considered the staff and all classmates his friends."

Rest in peace, old friend.

MEMORIES OF JERRY

"'Heartfelt' — that was Jerry Ness. I remember his big easy grin and his bear hugs. He was so humble and pleased to show the oil paintings he'd done over the years, and to share food at his table. His warm kindliness to my late husband Woods always touched me. He was a sweet-hearted treasure of a man." (Marda Messick)

"After his military career ended, Jerry continued to serve our community, our country and the military as an administrator of the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) assessment to high-school students. How surprised I was the first time he came into my guidance office. For many years I called ASVAB time 'St. Stephen Day,' because I knew Jerry would come a little early and we would have a chance to chat about our St. Stephen family, his children, my children and life in general. What a wonderful, caring man" *(Sharon Simmons)*

"In the 1980s, I bought a worn-out old VW Beetle. The previous owner had painted it the color of watered-down pea soup – with a brush. After I saved up a little money, I wanted to get it repainted, and I knew just the kind, talented, trustworthy guy who could help me. At that time, Jerry had a little side business: a tiny rented space where he could do paint jobs. My ugly duckling of a Beetle became a shiny red beauty with yellow wheels, thanks to Jerry."
