## 'WHEN TWO OR THREE ARE GATHERED': EXCERPT FROM PASTOR TOM'S SERMON

... Jesus gave us a checklist of what to do. A four-step process of not only church discipline, but relationship discipline.



- Step One: If you're sinned against, then tell the offender, one on one.
- Step Two: If the person doesn't listen, repeat Step One but with the presence of two or three trusted witnesses.
- Step Three: If no reconciliation comes even then, tell the church or the community of believers.
- Finally, if none of that works, regard the person as a Gentile or a tax collector. Which on the surface feels kinda harsh. Yet the purpose of these steps is to care for people, not to issue a guilt-free way to cut people out....

A problem is that churches ... find these steps not as ways to reconciliation, but as ways to "whip people back into shape," or to "deal with troublemakers" so that they don't come around anymore. Jesus spoke about conflict-resolution strategies that protected all the parties involved and encouraged continued dialogue.

Most of us have heard the phrase "when two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." We hear it and think beautiful thoughts of Christ being present in our worship.... And it is true. Jesus is there. But in this context, Jesus makes us aware of a different truth..... When two or three gather to speak to one another and gather to resolve conflicts, using his method, then Jesus is there, too. The next time we are working to resolve conflict with one another, knowing that Jesus is there may help keep the tone and words from being hurtful....
