

Emily says she joined in 1964. So did Billie, although she and her husband had started visiting in fall 1963, right after they moved from San

Martha's math is a bit more complicated. She attended when she was a Florida State student. According to church records, she actually had her membership transferred to St. Stephen in 1957. But the way Martha remembers it, she didn't become an active member until 1966: "I moved to Gainesville when my husband, Ray, was in law school, and then to Lakeland, and then back to Tally."

Emily is best-known for her decades-long care of our grounds, but she recalls serving in a different way early on: "Martha and I taught Sunday school together for several years. I sat – Martha taught!" Billie admires Emily's heat-withstanding stamina but appreciates that her own counting, columbarium and Altar Guild work allows her to stay cool inside.

Martha, Emily and Billie have been role models of quiet, steadfast, invaluable service. We thank God for them.
