


What a blessing that Erik has chosen us. Please make him feel welcome.

### **'THANKS FOR DOING YOUR PART'**

First, Monday's COVID update from the FSU College of Medicine: "Just when you thought it was safe to put aside your masks ... there's a new COVID surge



in Europe, with increasing numbers of severe illness, hospitalizations and deaths. If history holds for this, the U.S could follow a similar pattern in a month or so. One main theory is that the shift into fall weather (and fall behaviors) is contributing to the surge, because it's not a new variant. However, there are a host of new

variants identified. The clear message: get your booster and flu vaccines ASAP. The best protection is vaccination – and less than 40% of the U.S. population has received a booster."

If I may offer my perspective as a person (very slightly) over 65 who has battled cancer twice in the past five years: COVID-19 isn't going away, and we have to learn to live with it. Influenza used to kill hundreds, if not thousands, of people each year before flu shots became widely available. Yes, people still die from the flu, but few who have been vaccinated against it. Let's approach COVID the same way and get vaccinated and boosted to protect ourselves and those around us as we adjust to the new normal. It's great to see faces again at church now that we no longer require masks. I look forward to ditching my mask as soon as I get the "all clear" that my latest round of treatments was successful. We need to remember that we're all in this together, and not getting vaccinated and boosted isn't just a personal choice. Not getting a tetanus shot after cutting yourself on a rusty nail is a personal choice, because if you get tetanus, the rest of us can't catch it from you. The same can't be said for COVID. Thanks for doing your part to keep us all safe!

## NONSTOP THANKING: EXCERPT FROM PASTOR'S SERMON

... Worship is always linked to gratitude. We must be reminded of this. That is the big deal about this one leper who returns to Jesus. It wasn't just he who was healed. Ten called for help to get back in touch with life, family and faith. And all 10 received it, but only one returned to give thanks.

Our translation writes it as "He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him." That is, he falls face down at Jesus' feet and thanks Jesus – but "thanked" should not be past tense. It is in the present perfect in the Greek. Not a once-and -done. I know, I'm a word geek! But it matters. He fell at Jesus' feet *thanking* him. See the difference the *-ing* makes? A constant state of gratitude....
