
MAKE THEIR CHRISTMAS BRIGHTER




THE TRANSIENTS' TALE

... Ministers reeled off a wish list of resources that would make [working with transients] easier, including more shelter beds, alcohol-treatment programs and money for social services. But in the end, [Father Roy Marien at the Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More] said, there are no easy answers - only the continuing challenge to love in the midst of harsh circumstances.

The risk and pain hit home this spring to Ruth Shields, secretary of Oak City Assembly of God on U.S. Highway 90. Usually content to dispense grocery vouchers, she found herself wrapping her arms around a 19-year-old youth named Cisco, who was walking home to Mexico in a pair of uncomfortable dress shoes.



"Honestly, it just broke my heart," she said. "I could tell he was lonely, he was tired, he was upset. That could have been my son. That mother instinct came through."


She still wonders how the teenager is doing. As in most of these cases, there's no way to know.

ABOLISHING THE DEATH PENALTY

People in the Tallahassee area who support the abolition of Florida's death penalty will gather Wednesday, Nov. 30, for a prayer service at Good Shepherd

Catholic Church, 4665 Thomasville Road. The service begins at 7 p.m. and is open to the public. It will include the reading of the names of 99 people executed by the state since 1976, along with the 205 names of their victims. Florida is one of 27 states that have a death penalty.



EXCERPT FROM PASTOR TOM'S REFORMATION SUNDAY SERMON

... In my study, one of the commentators I follow is Father Richard Rohr. His words speak of deep wisdom to me. This week, they directed me to a section in the Wisdom of Solomon book in the Old Testament. In that section of the Bible called the Apocrypha, we are told of a God who is all-powerful and merciful.

It says in Chapter 11: "the whole world before you is like a speck that tips the scales, and like a drop of morning dew that falls on the ground. But you are merciful to all, for you can do all things, and you overlook people's sins so that they may repent.

For you love all things that exist, (breathe that in a second) and detest none of the things that you have made, for you would not have made anything if you had hated it. How would anything have endured if you had not willed it? Or how would anything not called forth by you have been preserved? You spare all things, for they are yours, O Lord, you who love the living."

This is wisdom language from God. There's a purity, and a tranquility in God's word which draws us into relationship. An inviting God that calls, offers forgiveness and leads us to joy....
