# THANK GOD FOR YOUR GENEROSITY

The financial updates are really upbeat this week.

First, let's look at the Capital Campaign for our sanctuary work. The budget, you'll recall, is nearly \$197,000. Counting the money that's been pledged but not yet given, all we need to cross the finish line is \$1,825. "I am blown away by the generosity of St. Stephen and the financing of this much-needed work without going to get a loan," Pastor Tom said. "Praise the Lord!"

Now, let's look at pledges for the 2022 budget. "As of Dec. 8," Pastor said, "we have received pledge cards from 35 people/families for a total of \$142,630 in planned giving to St. Stephen ministries. Of that total, 16 people/families increased their giving from last year for a total amount of \$13,520." So far, two people who didn't give pledges last year have done so for the upcoming year. Well done, St. Stephen.

If you haven't already, please turn in your pledge as soon as possible. The more pledges we get, the easier it is for our Church Council representatives to prepare a budget for 2022. Send in a pledge card if you have one. Or, easier still, just leave an email or phone message for Office Manager Lori. Bless you.

Editor's note: My Midwest brother-in-law Richard Koekneke, a retired pastor in the Missouri Synod (and a terrific jazz pianist), last year compiled a few dozen columns he had written with advice for fellow pastors. He packed a lot of wisdom into those columns, even for those of us who'd never dream of becoming pastors. Here's an excerpt that reminded me how hard our own pastors, past and present, have worked to help you and me make sense of our lives.

"As you go about the work of sermon preparation and preaching, worship planning and leading, class preparation and teaching, meeting deadlines of every description, dealing with staff concerns, addressing relational issues in the congregation, helping people handle life crises and calamities, visiting the sick in the hospital and the home and the nursing home, rejoicing at the birth of a baby or the new birth of a believer in holy baptism, helping dying people face the facts of their condition with the eyes of faith in Christ, walking with grieving families through their pain and sadness, helping couples prepare

for the great adventure of marriage, addressing the moral issues that are so rampant in our society, disciplining seekers and reaching out to unbelievers, working with lay leadership, dealing with the church budget, representing Christ in your community, enduring all those evening meetings – all the while trying to manage your own household well and trying to take care of yourself – know this: You are doing great and important work. You are making a Christ-like difference in this world and for eternity. You are



touching lives with the truth and love of Jesus Christ. Thank you for giving to the Lord."

# 'HOPE FOR EVERYONE': EXCERPT FROM SUNDAY'S SERMON

"... People came out to hear John speak the Word of God. Sometimes God was smiling and sometimes God was frowning. Like the people who heard John and felt the Word from God in their bones, we also have a choice. We can choose to live in fear or we can choose to live in love. We can get to work removing roadblocks put up to keep people down, or we can wait for God to blast them away.

"Clearly, the political authorities and the religious authorities are not the final authority. And we know it when God's Word speaks; God is here. We feel it deep in our bones and it chokes us up.



"This is Advent, it can be the greatest feeling and the most frightening to be cleansed by fire and scrubbed with fullers' soap, but there's hope in the final words today. Hope for everyone with ears to hear ... 'All flesh shall see the salvation of God.' And the last I checked, 'All' means 'All'!"
