GOOD NEWS FOR MANNA

As our recent newsletters have explained, #GiveTLH is a community effort underwritten by philanthropist and businessman Rick Kearney that spotlights



local nonprofits. Manna on Meridian, the food pantry that St. Stephen and other congregations support, was one finalists for micro-grants. The GiveTLH results were Stephen and other congregations support, was one of six announced Dec. 10, and Jamie was there. Here is her report.

I showed up in my best dress recently to the Osceola Grill, on FSU's campus, for the GiveTLH award show. I had a view of Doak Campbell Stadium as I socialized with my fellow Manna volunteers for the first hour. The anticipation built as a decadent and delicious dinner and dessert were served. As the last dessert plates were carried away, they started playing the heartfelt videos that had been made to promote and highlight each charity organization. The video for Manna highlighted the impact we have on our local community. It was so thrilling to hear Shellie and Burt in the video, and it renewed my hope that Manna might have a shot at winning some money.

Finally they announced the winners, and my heart soared when they announced that Manna had gotten third place and won \$2,500 from Rick Kearney and the Beatitude Foundation! As they took the picture of our group with the trophy, I knew that the extra money would allow us to help many more people in the coming months.

I hope that this win will inspire others to get involved. I have been volunteering at Manna since I was in high school. I continue to help because of the tangible difference that I can make. Everyone at Manna is committed to helping those in need, and the leadership is always looking for how to stretch resources further to help more people.

First place went to Redemptive Love Farm and Rescue, which received \$10,000 in grant funding and \$10,000 in marketing services from Bowstern Marketing. The Blessing Cup, which provides shelter, food, clothing and financial assistance for what it calls "the elderly poor," came in second and received a \$5,000 grant.
