THREE CHEERS FOR OUR FINANCE COMMITTEE

For the record, and for those who missed it, this is the letter that the new Finance Committee sent out last week. It appears that we're in very good hands.

Thanks to each of you for your participation in our February congregational meeting. At that meeting, we voted to form a Finance Committee. The Council appointed the committee in March, and we are pleased to provide an update



about our work. Our role is not to make decisions on how we spend money; those decisions remain with the Church Council. Our job is to review the church's financial situation so we can advise the Council and offer recommendations.

We had our first meeting on April 16, 2025. The committee members are Rudy Hehn (chair), Margaret Bowers, Jen Dritt, Audrey Post and Sylvia Smith. We discussed our goals and how the committee could be helpful to the church and the Council. Our second meeting was May 21, and we met again June 11. Our new accounting software is a useful tool to assess our church's financial condition and to make thoughtful recommendations to our Church Council. These are our immediate goals:

- Assess how we manage our accounts and expense categories.
- Finish our review of the church audit completed in April (we found no alarming issues on our preliminary review).
- Work with Council and Pastor on the job description and salary of our new office manager. (This has been done.)
- Decide the best ways to give open, clear and useful financial information to our congregation.
- Begin budgeting for 2026.

Long-term goals:

- Review the past five years of income and expenses and give a report to the congregation.
- Encourage financial support for the mission of SSLC.
- Establish the best practices for managing our finances.

You probably noticed a financial report last month in the weekly email newsletter, something we plan to do in the first newsletter of each month going forward. We want to give an accurate financial overview to the congregation without causing people's eyes to glaze over, so please ask if you want more information. Transparency is key.

We are happy to report that in response to the congregational meeting, many families increased contributions to the church this year. We realize not everyone is able to increase giving right now, and we understand. Thank you again, siblings in Christ, for your support, your generosity, and your commitment to the wonderful worship community that is St. Stephen Lutheran Church Tallahassee, ELCA.

A SURPRISE UNDER THE HOOD

Our first trip to dinner in Orlando was an adventure. At a major intersection, we saw a stray kitten in front of us as we waited for the light to change. The kitten

was disoriented and dangerously close to the cars crossing before us. Jonas considered getting out to help, but we were worried about safety and didn't want to scare the kitty into the road.

That was when it began walking toward us. People in a nearby car honked and said the kitten was underneath our car. We all got out (since our light was still red) and looked under the car, but didn't see the kitten. Relieved, we thought he'd gotten off the road.


But then the others said he'd crawled up into the engine



compartment of our car! We got back in and, when the light turned green, slowly drove into a hotel parking lot across the street. Jonas crawled under the car, and I popped the hood. Colleen and Rita looked everywhere.

Finally, we saw the kitten but couldn't get hold of it to pull it out. We tried honking the horn, but the kitten continued to hunker down. We tried several more times to get it, then decided to leave the vehicle, hoping that the kitten would feel safe and walk away on its own. Twenty minutes later, it hadn't moved. We decided to find the nearest auto repair to see if they could put our car on a lift and help get the cat out safely.

Slowly, we drove about a mile to a tire repair shop, but their lifts were busy for at least another hour. The manager suggested we use their hose to flush the kitten out. That was the answer to our prayers! After we ran the hose about 30 seconds, the kitten managed to climb up to a tight spot where Jonas and I could reach it. Our four hands guided it through the engine hoses and brackets. The kitten was frightened but didn't fight us. It was so tired, it gave up resisting and allowed us to help.



The manager of the tire shop brought us a box to put the kitten in. But when Jonas put the scared kitty in the box, it jumped out quickly and ran toward a dumpster. We were relieved it was OK and not on a busy road. We were also behind a grocery store, so there'd be options for food in the dumpster – and maybe a safer home in the future.
