SUMMER CAMP VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

I learned about Sowing Seeds Sewing Comfort Ministry (SSSCM) through the Manna on Meridian volunteer email list. Manna and SSSCM are longtime ministry partners. Founded in 2006 by Elder Charlotta Ivy, SSSCM lives up to its



name: "sowing seeds" by tending to the iGrow youth farm, and "sewing comfort" through sewing classes, regular food distributions and year-round support for the community. Through their partnership with the Tallahassee Food Network, which owns the iGrow farm and handles registration, Elder Charlotta and her husband, Elder Archie lvy, host a summer camp for 50

children and teens (ages 8-17), running this year from June 16 to July 18. Manna supports the camp by contributing food and by spreading the word – and that's where you come in.

THE NEED:

Volunteers are needed to teach or lead morning activities from 9 to 11 a.m., Monday through Friday. Most activities take place at the iGrow youth farm at 611 Dent St.; in case of rain, camp is moved indoors to the Florida People's Advocacy Center at 603 N. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.

The children come from lower-income households, and one of the goals of this camp is to ensure they have access to nutritious meals and meaningful enrichment during the summer. After morning activities and lunch, the group heads to FSU for afternoon programming.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

If you have a talent, hobby or area of knowledge you'd enjoy sharing with young people, this is a great opportunity to make a difference. Whether you're available once, weekly or more often, your contribution will be welcomed. Activity ideas include:

- Sewing or simple crafts
- Cooking (Note: The kitchen has only a two-eye stove)
- Jewelry making
- Bird watching
- Games and outdoor play (badminton, relay games, etc.)
- Any skill or interest you feel called to share

THE DETAILS:

- You can volunteer for a one-time class or on a weekly basis.
- Morning sessions run 9-11 a.m., or any portion you can manage.
- Volunteers provide their own materials.
- This is a volunteer opportunity (no payment).
