"I am excited and a bit nervous to walk in Lori's shoes," she said. "The job is different from what I currently do. With Lori's patience and guidance, I will do my best to handle the daily tasks she does so well."

Rita will be working 8 a.m.-1 p.m. at St. Stephen and 1:30-5 at Capital City Collision, where she has worked full time for years. Lori assures us that, even after she moves away, she'll be available for consultation – but she and Pastor Tom don't think it'll be necessary.

"Rita has quietly been working with Lori to learn the ins and outs of the position," Pastor Tom says. "Rita comes to the position with experience in bookkeeping and Excel. She's becoming adept at Publisher, the software used for bulletins and the newsletter. Rita does not need training in service and compassion, especially in feeding the hungry and building community.

The outcome of the story is a proclamation of new life that comes when a person is touched by Jesus. This once outcast and dangerous man becomes a beacon of hope to the community that cast him out. If they listen, then even their present situation is not the end of the story. Just as our present situation is not the end of ours.
