#### Mission

Team Richmond Basketball provides young men with the platform to showcase their talents in efforts to further their education as student athletes at the next level. Simultaneously, our organization strives to teach young men life skills, teamwork, positive character, citizenship, good work habits, self-motivation, and leadership.

Team Richmond Basketball is affiliated with the Amateur Athletic Union, a national organization with extensive experience in youth sports development. Team Richmond high school teams participate on the Hoop Group Basketball national circuit along with various other high-caliber competitive programs. On average, there are 175 young men that participate as well as 12 various local high school coaches from schools throughout the Greater Richmond area. Currently, the organization has 15 teams ranging in ages 10 – 17 that operates primarily between November and August each year. With the assistance of volunteer coaches, teams participate in tournaments with other AAU organizations from around the region.

## **History**

Team Richmond Boys AAU Basketball was founded in 2001 by a group of Richmond men who had enjoyed basketball as a vital formative experience in their lives and wanted to provide a similar experience for their children and others in the metropolitan Richmond area. It was determined that there was a need for a high-quality extramural program that would be not only a competitive athletic environment, but also a fertile training ground for "best practices" on and off the court.

Team Richmond Basketball joined the Garner Road AAU Basketball program in 2017 for the purpose of furthering opportunities and exposures for both organizations and its players. With a new vision and greater support, Team Richmond Basketball became its own and separate organization dedicated to enhancing player development, individual growth and mentorship for its players and coaches. In 2020, our organization celebrated 20 Years of Excellence in supporting the development of talented young men making Team Richmond one of the longest-standing organizations in the area and in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

## **Community**

Team Richmond is committed to community engagement and participation on various levels. As a 509a2 non-profit public charity, our goal is to support meaningful opportunities and teachable moments for the players and coaching staff affiliated with our program. In addition to instruction and assistance in the game of basketball, players and coaches undertake community projects to help other students, individuals, and families. We are continually reaching out to connect with other agencies in the greater Richmond area in support of a better community and nation.




#### **Financials**

Team Richmond AAU relies on the generosity and support of donations from corporations, businesses, individuals and other groups to assist in meeting the needs of program operations. As a 509a2 nonprofit public charity, we are registered with the State Corporation Commission.

Per our organization's bylaws, we have a volunteer Board of Directors comprised of corporate business representatives, community leaders, teachers, high school basketball coaches, a former college head basketball coach, former college athletes and other volunteers. This year for 2021/22 season we are launching a campaign to raise \$40,000.

Presented below is a high-level visual representation of Team Richmond's cost projections. Of note, uniforms and travel expenses, associated with tournament play, continue to be focus areas due to financial significance.



## **Director – Del Harris**



Coach Harris begins his fourth year as Director of this prestigious organization. His long and extensive background in AAU at every level has successfully impacted Team Richmond Basketball growth immensely. He began his AAU career early as a player at age 11 and was quickly noticed when he was named as a National AAU All-American in 1992. He later played in the 17-U National Championship game in 1995 where his team finished second in the country. After college, Harris pursued an opportunity to serve as an Assistant AAU coach and shortly became the Head Coach of Team Richmond's 17-Elite team where he served for six years. He has coached and aided in the development of more than 1000 players who continued their basketball careers at college and professional levels. Harris is a former Division III College Head Coach, Assistant AD and has been a Division I Assistant at three different universities.

Separate from Team Richmond Basketball, Harris is employed as a full-time faculty member, Head Boys Varsity Basketball Coach and Program Leader at the Collegiate School. He is Director of Basketball operations at U-Turn sports and Vice President of the 804 Coaches for Change. He also operates the Del Harris Basketball Leadership mentoring programs in both Chesterfield and Henrico County Public Schools offering leadership training to middle school students. An active member of his community, Harris serves on several local nonprofit and community outreach organization boards.
