When Snow is A No-Go

A reminder we rely on County services for roadway snow removal. Caitlin and Amethyst Loop are among the county's 'Priority 2 Roads,' with service assured within 36-72 hours of its accumulation. Newberry Hill and Eldorado are among 'Priority 1 Roads.' On those occasions when snow removal seems imminent, it is essential cars <u>not be parked</u> along Amethyst Loop. History has shown the county's willingness also to plow our two cul-desacs when they are free of parked cars.

Also important is to refrain from setting or leaving trashcans out under such conditions, during which Waste Management is unlikely to provide service. Urged is to save yourself container out-and-backs by downloading the WM app for service alerts. Early notice of planned plowing is not always possible, given the dynamic nature of road and weather conditions and county-wide service demands. Per County regulation 9.28.020, sidewalk snow removal is the responsibility of adjacent property owners, but we are sometimes aided in that effort by neighborhood volunteers.

Among timely tasks, aka opportunities, for gardeners at this time of year—

- Divide perennials
- Harvest winter squash and pumpkins
- · Plant berries and bare-root plants
- · Rake and store leaves
- Set out slug traps
- Leave some seed heads of perennial herbs as winter forage for birds
- Put away tools and hoses
- Sand wooden tool handles and preserve with linseed oil
