Keeping Your Mailbox in Tiptop Shape

Durable, locking 'Mail Boss' mailboxes throughout HP2 were acquired and installed for property owners several years ago primarily as a neighborhood security measure, and they have proven their worth. Made of heavy-gauge steel, our 'Mail Boss' boxes are designed to withstand the elements. Welcomed efforts may help assure their longevity and appearance. Cleaning them and keeping locking mechanisms lubricated are urged, whether by each box owner or by someone

whose box lies among those in a respective cluster, i.e., a cluster captain or even better, a mailbox hero. (Think Foreigner's 'Juke Box Hero') Cleaners such as 409 or Mr. Clean and a sponge or rag work well. Attempt to reach all sides of boxes, mindful of the narrow space between them. Plus, like nearly any padlock or door-lock, our mailbox locking mechanisms benefit from an annual spritz of WD40 or 3-in-1 oil. A quick spray or minor drip of oil into the keyhole, or onto the key, followed by gentle

movement of your key into the mechanism, helps spread the healing magic through the internal tumblers.

Your mailbox key has an engraved key number. Be sure to record and store the number, as replacement keys, other parts and even locking mechanisms are available if needed at mailboss.com or 1-800-589-7990. You may also reach out to the HOA with any questions, concerns or requests for help.
