I have prioritized and commented on many of the bills on my own. I would appreciate any comments you might have. I can relay any concerns you may have during the DWCF zoom meetings.

There have been three special sessions - 2025 A, 2025 B, and 2025 C. These are also captured in the spreadsheet.

The primary focus of the special sessions was immigration. It seems that there was a power struggle with Desantis, but it was ultimately resolved in Session C. Major decisions must be made unanimously by a panel and not just the governor or a single cabinet member.

The new law includes:

- Coordination between state and federal immigration agencies, both enforcement and training
- · Grants, includes "bonuses" for law enforcement
- Sublet detention beds to ICE
- Ban local government "sanctuary policy"
- Provide unauthorized alien transport, to be reimbursed by the federal government
- Enhanced criminal penalties for unauthorized aliens, including death sentence for capital felony
- No in-state tuition waivers for Dreamers

DWCUP Who We Are

The DWCUP is one of 66 Democratic Women's Clubs of Florida, begun by women in Pinellas County on September 9, 1940, forming the Democratic Club of Upper Pinellas County. Today, DWCUP carries on their goals.

The Democratic Women's Club of Florida, Inc. (DWCF, Inc.) began in 1956, on May 24, the day chosen by First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt as Democratic Women's Day, with the aim to unite all Democratic Women's Clubs in Florida by providing a forum for discussion of public matters, supporting qualified candidates for public office, and encouraging qualified Democratic women to seek elected positions. In the 1980's, DWCF became a full member of the National Federation of Democratic Women (NFDW). DWCF is a separate entity from the Florida Democratic Party but DWCF is recognized as the Florida Democratic Women's Caucus because DWCF maintains full membership in the NFDW.

DWCF members and clubs support campaign activities. The DWCF recruits women to run for political offices. The DWCF Political Committee which disseminates money to DWCF-endorsed candidates. The Legislative Chair and Legislative Liaisons of the DWCF, Inc. serve as the grassroots legislative advocacy arm of the DWCF, to monitor and lobby for or against legislation that has a dramatic impact on the lives of the citizens of Florida.
