Strong Back. Soft Front. Wild Heart. Brené Brown

One of the most valuable gifts in my life was from my mom. She taught us to never look away from pain. The lesson was simple and clear:

Don't look away. Don't look down. Don't pretend not to see hurt. Look people in the eye. Even when their pain is overwhelming. And when you're hurting and in pain, find people who can look you in the eye.

We need to know we're not alone—especially when we're hurting.

From the dehumanizing trans laws in Texas to the invasion of Ukraine, I know so many of us are hurting right now. Let's not look away from each other. Let's not look away from the moments of joy and connection in our lives because we feel guilty—the world needs us to put more joy into the world. And even though our \$5 donation or a single call to a representative might feel small compared with the enormity of the issues, let's not look away from helping. It matters so much.

Counting the Homeless

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires Continuums of Cares (CoC) to conduct a point-in-time (PIT) count of persons experiencing homeless at least every two (2) years.

The Tampa/Hillsborough County CoC conducts a homeless count annually. Count the homeless! There's an app for that! and hopefully, the information will be put to good use. The process started long before I got involved. My involvement consisted of replying to the email, attending an approximately I hour Zoom Instructional Meeting. A Point in time is a limited period in January that throughout the U.S. the homeless are counted. The clients are asked questions such as: Where did you sleep last night? Do you have access to medical care? Is there a history of physical limitations? Is there a history of mental illness? Data entry is to be exactly what they tell you. I chose the early shift so at 5:45am, the group of volunteers were pulling on the identifying t-shirts and reviewing the "app for that". We then separated to various locations. It was cold and blustery. My assignment was at a place where meals were served..... at 8am. It was 6am and there were several there waiting. The first interviewee and I laughed our way through the questionnaire. We both were new to "an app for that"! We viewed the questions and picked the most appropriate answers. We decided, "on the street" was most appropriate as there was no description for where he slept. It was not in a bed, like you and I. He then took charge and helped recruit several interviewee's explaining what we were doing. Queen Saint was quite willing to talk to me. She said we were all angels. She wants the lady at the No Name Refuge fired because she wouldn't give a her a raw chicken to cook. The lady said she didn't have a kitchen. Queen explained she knows how to build a fire and would be able to cook the chicken in her pot. Did the lady at No Name Refuge think she was stupid?

My job was to answer the computer questions.... one fella said no to having mental illness. He later talked of being hospitalized in a psych hospital but didn't know what for. His mother kicked him out when he was 18 because she was glad to get rid of him and he's been homeless ever since.

How do I answer that with a computer and the instruction to answer what the other person said? A 40-year-old fella left his new house, fancy car, job and is living on the streets. He is happy now... none of the hassle of life.

He gets to sleep on the beach. One couple is living in a hotel... they are only homeless 9 days a month when their money runs out. His ex-wife is with them. They are helping her out because she's alone. 9AM, it was time to close our shift. The time went quickly. I'd like to give a "shout out" to the police involvement. The day I worked, there was a "Cold front" coming in. The police came more than once to encourage relocation to an actual shelter. Respect flowed between both parties, which told me loud and clear the police were not feared within this particular group of people. I just wonder how many police academies teach that this will be one of the jobs they will need to do.

We have preconceived notions on who the homeless are. Yes, there is substance abuse and mental illness. Yes, some are there due to bad luck (and a poor personal support system) and are trying to find their way out of a hole. I admire their spunk for survival, organization skills, industry (possessions are in a backpack, it's miles to walk for meals or health care or to simply sleep.) and positivity (most were open to conversation and most of them had a plan to survive and improve their lot whether it was based on reality or not). Religions teach us to love our neighbor but doesn't define that neighbor as only one who looks and acts like you or me. ~ANONYMOUS
